17-Year-Old 'Knifing' Victim Changes Story

A 17-year-old Torrance youth picked up by police on May 5 has revealed in a signed statement that he lied when telling them he had been cut after being involved in a fight at a dance.

Torrance police picked up the youth Saturday night, May 5, behind Torrance Memorial Hospital where friends had taken him to have a cut on his arm treated. At that time police said he was intoxicated, tried to escape them, and told them he had been involved in a fight at a dance and did not know how or who had cut him.

Speculation that last Saturday night's dance at the YWCA was canceled because of this incident is not true, according to YWCA Executive Secretary Carol Wood. The dance was canceled late Friday afternoon because of a lack of adult chaperones, she said.

The dance this Saturday has also been canceled but this is because of high school proms being held, she added. Dances are scheduled for Tuesday, May 29 and through the middle of June, she said.

SINCE THEN, the youth told police he was cut when he got mad and put his hand through the window of a home. He lied because he was on probation for drinking, police said.
