Hull, superintendent of the Torrance schools, will accept the class for graduation from Principal Collins. Diplomas will be presented by William Hanson, president of the Board of Education.

THE 1962 class includes people from a variety of vocational occupations, all of whom will have completed their high school education at no small cost in time and effort. Numbered among the graduates are 48 veterans of various branches of the armed services; an airlines pilot; several housewives; one married couple, a mother and son; office workers; policemen; a fireman, and industrial workers. They range in age from 17 to 56, and the average age is 33.6 years.
