able for years. DR. REGINALD H. SMART, chairman of the LACMA Public Health committee, said the
association agrees California Medical Assn. and Public Health officers who have recommended against
mass oral immunization pro grams during the summer. Oral vaccine, which contains live polio virus, is believed to
be less effective during warm be less effective during warm
weather because of the presence of other, enteric (intestin-
al) viruses which al) viruses which are wide-
spread even among the healthy will be over in the fall and
it will be possible to reach a greater proportion of the popDOCTOR - ${ }^{-}$DOCTOR Smart stressed
that parents should see that that parents should see that
they and their children are shots during the summer, so
the children establish their eligibility to enter school in
the fall. Proof of immuniza. tion will be required of all children starting school in
September. September.
There are three separate strains of polio virus, which will make it necessary, to conduct three separate clinics at
given intervals to obtain the given intervals to obtain the
fullest possible measure of protection, Dr. Smart said.

A donation of 25 cents per person will be asked at each of the three clinics. How. ever Dr. Smart emphasized
that those who cannot pay will receive the vaccine free, as
they do in all of the Salk vac cine clinics now being held
the County Medical Assn.
