SCARCELY was the ink dry on this law before strenuous efforts to repeal it, or amend efforts to repeal it, or amend it in various ways, were started. Numerous bills on the matter were introduced in our 1961 session, but none were passed. In our 1962 budget session an Assembly resolution was adopted, calling for an interim study of whether the deadline date should not be postponed for another four years. A subcommittee of the Assembly education committee recently held two days of hearings on the matter.

Quite a parade of witnesses

Quite a parade of witnesses appeared and presented test mony on aspects of the prelem. Trustees and superintendents from districts in various parts of the state, county superintendents and county superintendents. committee members, spokes-men for interested organiza-tions, and officials of the state department of education were in attendance.

THE SUBCOMMITTEE was informed that five counties now have a single, unified school district. Two others have completed their master plan studies. All of the others have at least started the studies and hearings legally required, and many are well on the road to completion. The department of education estimates that less than a dozen counties will be unable to make the Sept. 15, 1963 dead-line. THE SUBCOMMITTEE was

The California Commission on School District Organization made up of representations in the educational fields, which drafted and sponsored the master plan law in 1959, indicated its oposition to any extension of the dealline. Its spokesman reviewed a recent survey, in which 33 county school superintendents gave the opinion that there is no need for an extension of the deadline. Only 15 believe there should be an extension, and of these, 5 believe the State Board of Education should be permitted to grant extensions for good cause.

THE DEPARTMENT of education recommended that the law be amended to authorize the Board of Education to grant extensions beyond the present deadline for not more than one year for substantial cause. It also recommended elimination of a quirk in the present law, under which minorities of voters have several times defeated a reorganization plan approved by a county committee and the State Board. It also suggested a change in the financing formula to aid newly consolidated districts in meeting salary and staffing problems at the outset.

The subcommittee was re-quested to hold further hear-ings on such matters as what to do with the 508 districts which had less than 100 pupils in attendance last year, the 18 which had less than 26 pupils, or the 49 which enrolled less than 10. In such districts the unit cost is highest in relation to the education offered to to the education offered to their pupils.


