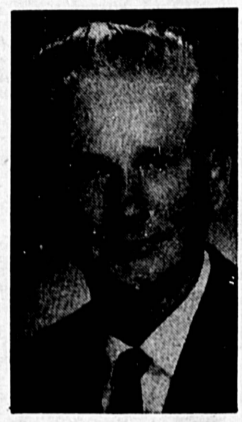
St. Gerard Council elects Frank Paluch

### Improvement Loans Eased By Cal-Vet

A recent administrative change has made Cal-Vet Home Improvement Loans available to a broader group of Cal-Vet contract holders.

Mrs. Sara R. Bridges, Torrance Veterans Service officer, said the effect of the change was to raise the ceiling on improvement loans from \$3,500 to \$4,000.

According to Mrs. Bridges, the California Department of Veterans Affairs has recognized the need for the loans and intends that such loans be made so long as the funds permit. Although the basic intent of the program is still to use existing moneys to meet the initial requests for the purchase of a farm or home says Mrs. Bridges, improvement loans are also needed to give the contract holding veteran the additional space needed to house a family that has increased during the loan period, and for major maintenance projects in the home.

Cal-Vet contract holders with home improvement plans and a need for a loan to carry out those plans, should contact their nearest Cal-Vet Farm and Home Purchase office says Mrs. Bridges. Experts in these offices will best be able to pass on the qualifications of the applicants.

To apply, Torrance veterans should contact the Division of Farm and Home Purchase office at 830 N. LaBrea Ave., in Inglewood.
