4,000 Set At Camino In Summer

More than 4,000 students are expected to register Monday and Tuesday in the first of two summer sessions to be offered by El Camino College.

The regular six-week summer session from June 20 to Aug. 3 will be followed by a four-week session from Aug. 6 to Aug. 31.

The first session will include both morning and evening classes, with 160 sections offered in a wide range of courses which include over 75 course titles.

INDIVIDUAL subjects will include anthropology, art, auto mechanics, biology, business, cosmetology, drafting, economics, engineering, English, French, geography, geology, German, health education, history, mathematics, music, philosophy, physical science, physics, political science, power sewing, psychology, radio-electronics, sociology, speech arts, theater arts, welding and zoology.

Courses in both summer sessions are tuition-free and carry regular college credit. The El Camino College District residence requirement is waived for the first summer session but not for the post session. Any high school graduate or person 18 years of age or older may attend.

ALL STUDENTS under age 21 are required to comply with the new state law regarding poliomyelitis immunization, as are students 21 or older who plan to enroll in four or more units in the first session or three units in the post session. Forms are available in the Registration Office and must be completed prior to registration.

Students completing the spring semester at El Camino College may register on Monday, June 18, and new or former students may register on Tuesday, June 19, with no late registration scheduled. Classes begin on Wednesday, June 20.
