No amounts for these purposes are stated, except that it is provided that not less than 80 per cent of the total (\$216 million) must be used for the needs of the colleges, junior colleges, and the University. The only pecific amount stated is that at least \$20 million shall be used for needs of junior colleges.

The bill reached the Senate floor the first night of our session. Two attempts were made to amend it. The first would be seen the session of the session of the session of the session. would have amended into it another Senate bill which would have reduced the amount of the bond issue to \$215 million, earmarked en-tirely for the educational institriery for the educational insti-tutions. The second would have specified the amounts to be used for the various purposes. Both amendments were de-feated, and the bill was passed with only two dissenting votes.

IN THE Assembly, four dif-ferent bond bills were intro-duced, none containing the en-tire program in the adminis-tration bill. One would have provided a separate bond issue for the state operated col-legiate institutions. Two would have provided bond funds for legiate institutions. Two would have provided bond funds for public junior colleges, but by different formulas. The last would have provided a bond issue for general state building

purposes.

In its first legislative action, the Assembly by a bare majority vote suspended its rule requiring a three-day interval between the introduction of a bill, or the receipt of one passed by the Senate, and its first committee hearing.

THE HEARING on the Senate bill by the Assembly ways and means committee was quite prolonged. After the opening statement by the author, several attempts to amend the bill were beaten back. After final action by the Assembly, it will once again be up to the voters to decide.
