At the regular meeting of the Torrance Optimist Club last week, funds were re-allocated for youth work which the club does.

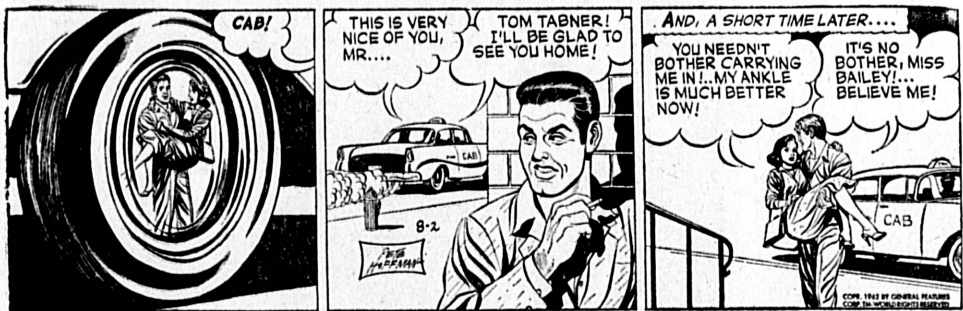
Unexpended money from the club's youth activity bud-
