# Food Giant President Gets Commission Post

Gov. Edmund G. Brown announced the appointment Monday of Theodore E. Cummings, president of the Food Giant Market of Los Angeles, as a member of the Commission on Judicial Qualifications.

Cummings succeeds Hugh Evans of Los Angeles, who recently resigned. His appointment is for four years and requires Senate confirmation.

"I AM gratified that Mr. Cummings has agreed to serve on the Commission on Judicial Qualifications," Governor Brown said. "He is a business leader and a member of my Business Advisory Council, and has been active for years in national charitable and philanthropic endeavors, including the Los Angeles Museum of Art. I know Mr. Cummings will be a great help to the Commission in carrying out its important responsibilities."

Cummings, 54, lives at 911 Hillcrest Road, Beverly Hills, with his wife and family. He has been a resident of California for 31 years.

In addition to being president and a member of the board of directors of Food Giant Markets, Inc., Los Angeles, he is a member of the boards of directors of numerous other companies, including Pacific Coast Properties, Inc.,

Guaranty Bank, and Crown Savings and Loan Co.

THE COMMITTEE on Judicial Qualifications was created by a recent amendment to the Constitution, and has power to investigate and consider complaints against justices and judges charging willful misconduct in office, willful and persistent failure to perform their duties, habitual intemperance, a disability seriously interfering with the performance of duties which is, or is likely to become, of a permanent character.

Under the law, the governor appoints the two public members of the Commission.

THIS YEAR, just as last year, the leading causes of accidents is speed, failing to yield the right of way, following too close, and the drinking

driver. Our traffic record is one to be proud of, but as long as we have fatal and injury accidents, we must be on the alert.

Our record so far this year shows that accidents can be reduced. Accidents still are made; they just don't happen.

LT. DONALD NASH, in charge of the traffic division, along with Chief of Police Percy Bennett, express deep appreciation to all drivers for their efforts and co-operation towards reduction of accidents.

Chief Bennett urges all drivers to continue giving this co-operation. It will be needed if future fatalities are to be prevented.
