State-wide Group Seeking Approval Of Proposition 24

Groups in 57 California counties who joined the drive to place the Louis Francis Constitutional Amendment on the November ballot have joined forces to make the amendment a part of the California Constitution.

The groups met at a Los Angeles hotel last week to set up a campaign organization. A steering committee, headed by Francis, Dr. John R. Lechner, and Arthur Arnold.

OTHER committeemen were appointed and the drive to make the measure, known officially as Proposition 24, a part of the state document was begun.

Headquarters for the Californians for Proposition 24 will be at 1415 S. El Camino Real, San Mateo, and at 1300 W. 8th St., Los Angeles.

Proposition 24 declares the existence of the world communist movement and recites the methods and objectives of the world communist movement. The amendment is designed to prevent the communist movement from accomplishing its objectives in California.

It spells out precise definitions of communist and subversive organizations.

THIS proposition provides that legal findings against organizations may be made "pursuant to law," in complete obedience to basic law, including the legal requirements and limitations already set forth in federal and California Constitutions. It does not create any new governmental authority to make findings of communist and subversive organizations, nor bestow such authority to any federal or state body which is not already so empowered.

It denies political status to communist and subversive organizations in California, and provides that names of communist and subversive organizations, and their members shall not be printed on ballots in California. Neither shall members of communist and subversive organizations hold public office or public employment.

It requires that all employees of all public educational institutions answer specific questions relative to past or present knowing membership in communist or subversive organizations that may be propounded by congressional or state legislative committees. Under this bill, any employee who refuses to answer such questions shall be subject to suspension and dismissal. It extends the Dilworth Act of 1953.

IT MAKES a felony for any person or organization to commit any act to overthrow the government by unlawful means while using public property. It imposes definite control upon the use of public buildings and public grounds by communist and subversive organizations or persons. It requires a statement of information to be filled by the applicant.

Communist and subversive organizations, and members thereof, shall not be allowed tax exemptions in this state. It spells out procedure for filing and obtaining approval of all tax exemption claims wherein a declaration of non-affiliation is required.

Should any portion of the amendment be declared unconstitutional, the remainder shall not be affected thereby.

Principles of Data Processing Offered

A class in the basic principles of data processing will be offered in the evening division during the fall semester at Harbor College, it was announced yesterday by Carmen Marinella, chairman of the business division.

The course, which meets from 6:30 to 9:30 on Friday evenings starting the week of Sept. 17, will investigate basic data processing equipment and application. It will feature discussions of automated record keeping, basic computer concept, and the application of computers to management problems. The course will include visits to data processing installations.

The instructor of the new course, Frank Fishbaugh, holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Southern California and has had many years of experience with industry in the field of data processing. He is presently employed as an operational auditor specializing in data processing control with Space and Information Systems Division of North American Aviation.

FISHBAUGH is a member of the Systems and Producers Assn., the National Assn. of Accountants, and the Institute of Internal Auditors.

"More than 5,000 electronic computers are in operation today," explained Marinella, "and forecasters tell us that five years from now there will be 10,000 to 15,000 at work in the United States alone. It behooves everyone in the field of business to inform himself of the impact and application of data processing equipment."

Special Projects Planned

Several special projects are planned for the coming school year in both elementary and high schools in Torrance. The projects are part of a continuing program to improve the instructional program.

Special emphasis will be given to the English-language arts program. The areas to be covered include spelling, handwriting, creative writing, and literature. Reading problems will also be given attention.

At the local high school, a newly revised social studies outline will place emphasis on economics and American heritage classes. At North High, staff members will be involved in accreditation and appraisal under the direction of the Western Assn. of Schools and Colleges.

Pilot programs in electricity and electronics will be launched at North and South High Schools. English and social studies teachers at all high schools will be revising the teaching guides for the classes.
