

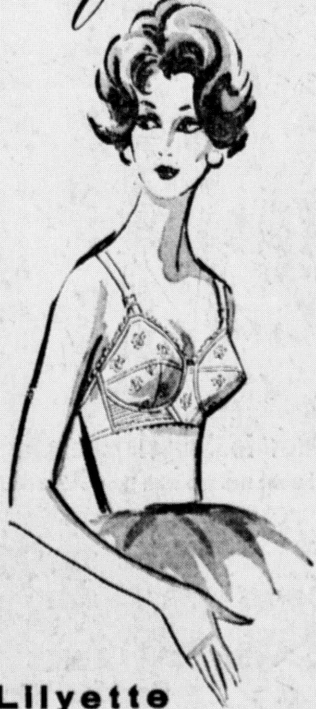
Man Joins Tech Staff

Lutheran School Set For Opening

Applications for the First Lutheran Elementary School for the fall term are now being accepted, according to the Rev. William J. Roleder.

School begins Sept. 11, and in addition to the three Rs, a fourth R, Christian education, will be offered.

The school will have classes for kindergarten through seventh grade. Bus service will be offered.

Entrance requirements are much the same as for the public schools. Youngsters enrolled for kindergarten classes must be five years of age prior to Dec. 1, 1962.

Noted Educator to Address Torrance Teacher Meeting

At the general orientation meeting of all teachers in the Torrance Unified School District to be held at 10 a.m. at the South Bay School gymnasium, Sept. 11, the timely topic of comparative education will be discussed by Dr. Wendell P. Jones, professor, School of Education, UCLA.

Dr. Jones' background of public school teaching in North Carolina, Florida, and Maryland, together with many years of visiting and studying education in Sudan, Ethiopia, Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika, Rhodesia, Belgian Congo, Nigeria, Ghana, and Liberia would seem to qualify him as an authority on comparative

education. He has contributed widely to the field of education, by serving as project secretary of the Educational Policies of the National Education Assn.; Unesco Programme Specialist, where he developed and reported the Unesco-sponsored Conference of All African States on the Development of Education in Africa; program director in the Peace Corps' "Teachers for Nigeria" training project at UCLA; and coordinator to two education programs in Nigeria conducted by UCLA under grants of the United States Agency for International Development and the Ford Foundation.

West High Dedication In October

A faculty of 40 teachers will greet a new student body of over 1,000 students, grades 9-12, when West High opens its doors for the first time this month, reported Dr. Robert Ford, principal.

"The course offerings for students," he stated, "will be similar to those of the other high schools in Torrance. A full calendar of student activities has been developed, including a rounded athletic schedule, and the student planning commission has been elected."

Following a series of planning meetings last spring, the West High PTA was organized under the leadership of Mrs. J. Kenneth Edwins, its president. A series of programs have been developed, the first of which will be the dedication of West High School, Thursday, Oct. 11.

Parents are encouraged to attend the dedication program and will have an opportunity to tour the new school at that time.

During the summer, counselors have been busily engaged in conducting parent conferences to plan a four-year program of studies for individual students. Other staff members have been receiving equipment, supplies and books in readiness for the opening

Carson High Heavy Hit By Vandals

Despite a heavy onslaught of vandalism, the Carson High School will have a completion date of Sept. 15, according to its contractors.

The new \$4.5 million plant at 223rd Street and Main was blistered by glass-breaking and wire-yanking youths until a month ago when a watchman became a fixture on the grounds.

SOME 2,476 students are expected to begin classes in February in the Los Angeles City School District structure. Enrollment figures for the first semester estimate there will be 1,111 tenth graders, 793 eleventh graders and 572 twelfth graders at Carson.

COVERING 32½ acres, the new institution will draw students from the Banning, Narbonne, and Gardena areas. By 1969, city school officials estimate there will be a total enrollment of 3,070 at Carson High.

A principal will be named for the school on Dec. 1.

Although contractors are optimistic on the finishing date, inspectors do not believe the project will be terminated before December.

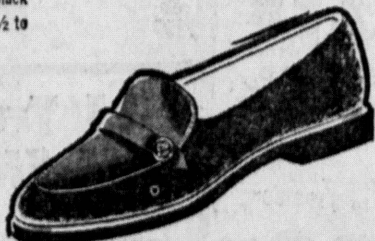
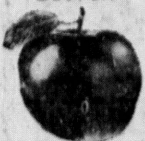

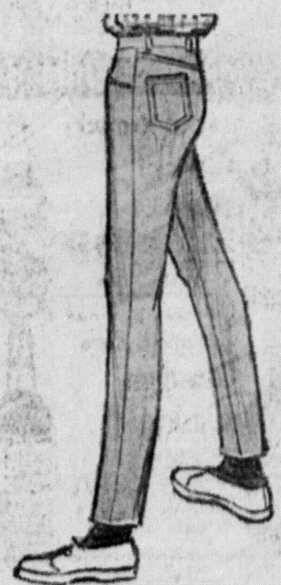
