Benny Goodman Pays Visit to Disneyland

Benny Goodman, whose magic clarinet and swinging jazz rolled back the Iron Curtain just two months ago, is bringing his 16-man "big band" to Disneyland for five consecutive nights, from Wednesday, Aug. 29 through Sunday, Sept. 2.

In his first Southern California appearance since his triumphant tour of Russia in June, Goodman will play for listening and dancing in the park's Tomorrowland Mall area from 8 p.m. to midnight Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday nights, and from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. Friday and Saturday evenings.

Regular ticket prices will prevail throughout the Goodman appearance, according to Disneyland officials.

The renowned "King of Swing" will bring with him

from the East a number of the outstanding jazz musicians who helped draw SRO audiences in Moscow and throughout their Soviet tour. And they'll play all the old Goodman favorites and special arrangements from "Stompin' at the Savoy" to "Sing Sing Sing."

The Disneyland engagement will mark Goodman's first Southern California performance in more than a year. His last Southland date was also at Disneyland, to open the park's summer nighttime season in May 1961.

In addition to Goodman and his band, "Disneyland After Dark" will feature its regular summer-long entertainment line-up of four dance bands on week nights and seven dance areas and bands on Friday and Saturday evenings.

Legion Chief Flays 'Anti' Literature

Tom Coffee, commander of Westchester American Legion Post 823, has declared that anti-Semitic and anticlerical literature of a false and evil nature is being distributed locally, as well as statewide, in a manner designed to implicate the American Legion.

Some subversive organization has, in some way, obtained a roster of the American Legion, Department of California, and a list of new District and Area officers not yet published, declared Coffee.

The information is mailed in plain envelopes without a return address. Some of the material has been mailed from Florida, and some from the Los Angeles area. Coffee stated that some of this received locally was postmarked Inglewood.

"These attacks are not only foreign to everything the American Legion stands for, but they are intended to stir up strife in a typical Communist-inspired underhanded way," said Coffee. "It is a well-known Communist tactic to initiate these terrible campaigns, using Nazi and Fascist type propaganda. Then they try to associate the American Legion and other patriotic organizations with it."

'Thincoat' Plastering Announced

A new plastering material, described by Building Codes as "thincoat" plastering, has improved the performance of walls and ceilings of the "nailed-on" variety by a substantial margin, announce researchers for the Southern California Plastering Institute, Inc.

Thincoat is said to be an ultra-high-strength gypsum material applied to thickness of as little as one-eighth of an inch over ordinary 4 ft. x 8 ft. gypsum lath materials. Clay Johnston, president of the institute, said that it has proved to be a decisive answer to the problems of many builders seeking lowest possible construction costs through the use of other materials that are generally regarded as substitutes for genuine lath and plaster.

"Thincoat was not created to replace the conventional application of lath and plaster in quality residential work. It was developed to increase the quality levels of installations in which wall and ceiling materials were nailed on, and the nails and nail depressions concealed from sight by the application of tapes and other materials," Johnston said that thincoat provides "a solid, smooth, hard and complete covering for any wall and can be painted or otherwise decorated in the same manner as conventional plaster."
