Rose Mary Ulland, parish worker, served as director of the two-week Vacation Bible School, Aug. 6-17, which was sponsored by the Board of Parish Education, Mrs. Larry Bego, chairman.

A SPECIAL feature of the Bible School this year was a class for high school and col-

lege young people on "Prayer and Spiritual Reflection" which was attended by 45 youths and taught by Pastor Maynard Mid-thun, pastor of the congregation. Garden Checklist

1. Plant winter sweet peas this month for bloom by Christmas.
2. Feed chrysanthemums again this month and stake them. Pinching should be confined to the removal of weak, side buds.
3. Many annuals, notably petunias, will give you a second bloom if you cut them back, feed and water them into new growth.
4. Azaleas and camellias should be fed lightly this month if you haven't already done it. Some varieties will drop their buds if over-fed.
5. Many vegetables may be planted this month for fall-winter harvest. Check with a local nurseryman.

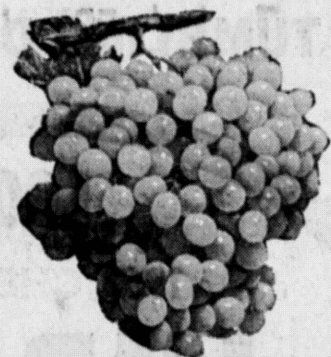
