### Public Notice

RESOLUTION NO. 82-164  
A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, INTENDING TO VACATE A PORTION OF YUKON AVENUE ADJACENT TO AND NORTH OF THE INTERSECTION OF THE SAN DIEGO FREEWAY IN THE CITY OF TORRANCE, PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS the City Council has decided to vacate a portion of Yukon Avenue adjacent to, and North of San Diego Freeway within the City of Torrance, more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the Northern line of the San Diego Freeway (258 feet wide), said Northern line (North 70° 10' 50" West, with the Western line of Yukon Avenue, 60 feet wide, as shown in Tract Map No. 15880, in the City of Torrance, County of Los Angeles, State of California, recorded in Book 463, Page 24 of Maps, records of said County, thence South 70° 10' 50" East, along said Northern line to a point of intersection with the Eastern line of said Yukon Avenue; thence Northern along said Eastern line of Yukon Avenue to a point of intersection with a line parallel with and distant thirty (30) feet Southwesterly from that portion of the newly relocated Yukon Avenue centerline which bears North 13° 17' 32" West as it existed July 27, 1962, said newly relocated portion lies immediately North of said San Diego Freeway; thence North 13° 17' 32" West along said parallel line to a point of intersection with said Western line of Yukon Avenue; thence Southern along said Western line to the point of beginning.

WHEREAS for the purpose of said proposed vacation the City Council elects to proceed under the provisions of the Statutes of California (Chapter 200, Statutes of 1941) as amended.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENJOINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.  
The City Council hereby declares its intention to vacate a portion of Yukon Avenue adjacent to, and North of San Diego Freeway, and more particularly shown upon a map bearing the legend "Map showing proposed vacation of a portion of Yukon Avenue adjacent to, and North of the San Diego Freeway in the City of Torrance," which map is hereby approved for the purpose of this proceeding, and is hereby ordered filed in the Office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance and marked "File as R 15880," and which map is hereby referred to for particulars as to the proposed vacation.

SECTION 2.  
That the 4th day of September, 1962, at 8:00 p.m. of said day, in the Council Chambers of the City of Torrance, California, at the time and place fixed for hearing all persons interested in or objecting to the proposed vacation.

SECTION 3.  
The City of Torrance does reserve and except from the vacation a permanent easement with the right at any time to construct, install, operate, replace, remove, renew and enlarge lines of pipe, conduits, cables, wires, poles, and other convenient structures, equipment and fixtures for the operation of gas, electric and telephone lines and for the transportation or distribution of electric energy, petroleum and its products, and water, including access and the right to keep the property free from inflammable material and wooded growth, and otherwise protect the same from all hazards in, upon and over the portion of Yukon Avenue proposed to be vacated.

SECTION 4.  
The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish a copy of this resolution in the Torrance Herald, a newspaper of general circulation published in the City, one time at least 10 days prior to the date of said hearing.

SECTION 5.  
The City Engineer is hereby directed to post conspicuously not less than four copies of this resolution not more than one hundred feet apart upon his boundaries of said land to be vacated.
