

Chapel Airs CDC's Stand On Martin Sobell Affair

Although I am a Republican, several members of the Democratic Party who are candidates for public office have thanked me for what I said in a recent issue of this newspaper about the California Democratic Council, especially its opposition to the U.S. House Un-American Activities Committee; its opposition to the publication of the names of witnesses subpoenaed by the House Un-American Activities

Committee; its opposition to federal and state loyalty oaths; its opposition to capital punishment; and its opposition to denying jobs in the California public schools to teachers who have been members of the Communist party, or members of the organizations identified by the U.S. Attorney General as "Communist front" organizations.

These Democratic Party candidates for public office, who are embarrassed by the extreme left-wing policy of the

California Democratic Council, told me that they do not dare openly repudiate completely the CDC, and even hesitate to repudiate some of the more extreme planks in the CDC. However, they asked me to publish the CDC stand on Martin Sobell, which I am glad to do.

MORTON SOBELL was convicted of aiding Julius and Ethel Rosenberg in their efforts to obtain U.S. atomic secrets and send them to the

Soviet Union. Morton Sobell has been identified on numerous occasions in U. S. Congressional hearings by corroborated witnesses as an active agent of Soviet Russia and the Communist party, and a close associate of Julius Rosenberg in the Communist party "apparatus," meaning the hard inner core of the Communists.

His release from prison has long been a pet project for agitation by both the Communist party and its numerous front organizations, constantly since

the conviction of the Rosenbergs. We do not say that the CDC is an organization of Communists, or that it is a Communist front, but we merely report the policy of the CDC regarding Morton Sobell and let the readers form their own conclusion.

AT FRESNO in February 1960, the CDC passed the following Resolution:

"Morton Sobell is serving his 10th year in prison. He has steadfastly proclaimed his in-

nocence throughout his imprisonment. Many eminent Americans and other world figures including jurists, scientists, and clergymen have a 100 expressed substantial doubt as to his guilt. There does exist the possibility of human error in matters of judgment that has been subjected to the political tensions of the day. CDC has traditionally expressed concern for possible infringements upon justice and civil liberty. CDC calls upon the President of the

United States to review again the facts in the Sobell case and take necessary action to secure ultimate justice."

WE HAVE examined the CDC platform and resolutions promulgated at the meeting in Santa Monica in March 1961; and the meeting in Fresno in January 1962, and cannot find any reference to Sobell. This can mean any one of several things, such as: (1) The CDC deemed it wise not to release public their stand on Sobell after 1960; (2) The CDC having made their stand on Sobell in 1960, assumed it was known to its members and no repetition was needed for public consumption; or (3) The CDC

decided to agitate for the release of Sobell through other organizations and individuals.

Write to candidates for public office and ask them to answer in writing the following questions:

(1) Do you know why Morton Sobell was sent to prison?

(2) Do you advocate that Morton Sobell should be paroled or pardoned, and thus get out of prison?

(3) Are you aware that the Communist party and its many "front" organizations want Morton Sobell released from prison?
