

Automation Subject of New Class

"Automation Science and Laboratory," a newly established course in the automation and the electro-mechanical curriculum, will be offered in the Evening Division at Harbor College in the fall semester, according to an announcement by George Rainey, chairman of the applied technology division.

The automation science class will meet Wednesday evenings from 6:30 to 9:30; the automation laboratory class will be held on Friday evenings from 6:30 to 9:30 beginning the week of Sept. 7. Prerequisite for the course is concurrent enrollment in a basic math class, or equivalent. The instructor will be Kenneth E. Berry of the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power.

The two classes teach the basic scientific principles that are used by technicians in industry. Technical terminology as used in practical application of automation technology is included. The laboratory section of the course gives practical experience in hydraulic systems, pneumatic systems, optics, and heat transference.

'Grandpa McCoy' to Spearhead Campaign for Proposition 24

Walter Brennan, veteran star of TV and motion pictures, will serve as state chairman of "Californians for Proposition 24," the statewide campaign organization formed recently by representatives of endorsing organizations and more than 50,000 volunteers from 58 California counties which qualified the Louis Francis anti-Communist constitutional

amendment for the Nov. 6 general election ballot. Brennan, who states that he will campaign vigorously for passage of Proposition 24, has played the part of the lovable and cantankerous "Grandpa" in "The Real McCoys" on television for the past six years. He also is the only three-time Oscar winner in motion picture history.

Fifty thousand aroused citizens took bold action in spring to invoke the right of the initiative petition. The obtained approximately a million signatures of voters to place the strongest anti-subversive measure on the November ballot," he said in accepting the state chairmanship.

"THIS WAS necessary because during the 1961 session of the California Legislature, anti-subversive measures were introduced by eight different members of both houses. Not one of these bills was enacted. The majority of these bills never even reached the floor for a vote.

Why this reluctance on the part of some of our elected representatives to take legal action against subversive elements in our state? Especially, since no major anti-Communist law has been enacted in California during the past decade," he continued.

"THE VOTERS of this state have now, for the first time, the weapon in their own hands for removing the power of the Communists, as Khrushchev has said, 'to enslave us by our own volition and to make us pay for our own enslavement.'"

"The Communists and subversives have thrown their highly organized, well-financed forces into an all-out campaign to defeat Proposition 24, stating that this must be accomplished at any cost. We are informed that they plan to do this through their usual subtle and deceitful methods, creating doubts and confusion in the minds of the unwary who are not wise to their tactics. We are witnessing the unfolding of this vicious plot to discredit the amendment," he stated.

He pointed out, however, that a "statewide grass roots organization will combat them and their confusion-propaganda campaign in each of the 58 California counties and will win votes for Proposition 24."

In addition, the historical and aesthetic importance of print making, its use as a means of personal expression, criteria for evaluation and criticism, and decoration and illustration will be treated in the lectures.

Heiner, instructor of the print making class, is a graduate of the College of Arts and Crafts as well as the California School of Fine Arts.
