## Health Officer Warns Influenza May Be Dangerous

Accurate predictions of disease epidemics are difficult to make, but recent and past patterns of the two-to-three year cyclic occurrence of Asian influenza suggest that widespread outbreaks of this disease may be expected in the United States during the coming winter months.

Several epidemics of Asian

influenza have been identified elsewhere in the world since the first of this year, notably in Japan, Korea, Russia, Hungary, Czechoslovakia, Norway, and the Netherlands. No major outbreak has occurred in the United States during this same period, but total influenza and pneumonia deaths per week have often exceeded the expected number.

Isolated cases of influenza have been reported from various sections of the United States, however, and the infective agent has been identified as the Type A-2 (Asian) influenza virus strain. This "seeding" of the Asian flu virus in the population is said to be another indication that major outbreaks of the disease will probably occur throughout this country during the 1962-63 winter season.

AS A RULE, the A-2 influenza virus strain causes a comparatively mild form of the disease and results in relatively few deaths. Strains from the Type B influenza viruses have also been identified in cases of influenza that have occurred, but these particular viruses rarely give rise to any serious illness and have never been the cause of any serious flu outbreak in this county.

Due, in a great part, to the general mildness of the Asian virus strain, mass community-wide influenza vaccination programs are not considered necessary by officials of the U. S. Public Health Service. Immunization against the disease is strongly recommended, however, in the case of certain vulnerable groups of individuals.

The people considered most susceptible to an attack of Asian influenza and the ones most likely to experience serious illness include all "older" persons, that is, those persons over 45 years of age and particularly those over 65; all individuals who suffer from a chronic and debilitating disease including heart and lung disorders, kidney disease, diabetes, Addison's disease, and other chronic conditions; and pregnant women.

IT IS understandable that vaccination is also encouraged for those individuals in the medical and health services, public safety and public utilities, transportation, and for those persons working in education and communications. Large scale immunization programs may also be advisable in certain industries and institutions where greater than usual absenteeism would create particular concern.

Influenza spreads so rapidly that once the disease hits a community it is too late for vaccination to do much good and is certainly too late to protect high-risk groups. Since it requires several weeks for the vaccine to build up any resistance to the disease within the body, it is advisable to obtain protection against the disease well in advance of the influenza season.

PREVIOUSLY unimmunized persons should receive two injections of influenza vaccine. The first injection is followed by the second in about two months. It is pointed out that even a single dose of the vaccine affords significant protection and is just that much better than none at all.

A single booster dose of vaccine is usually adequate for those persons who have previously received the polyvalent influenza vaccine (vaccine which contains protection against the most important influenza virus strains) within the past year.

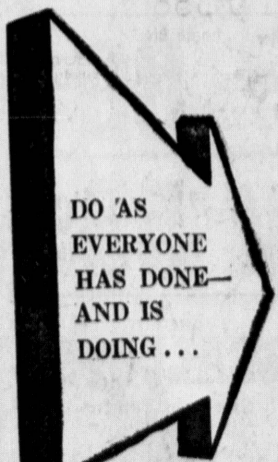
