## Space Age Opportunities Will Be Topic For Women Engineers

Three women engineers will form a panel to discuss opportunities for women in the space age at the opening meeting of the year of the Manhattan Beach Branch of the American Assn. of University Women, according to Mrs. Michael Lesh, president.

Two Manhattan Beach women, Mrs. Mildred Anderson and Mrs. Judith Siegel, and Miss Jane Osuga of Los Angeles will discuss their work in general terms and present trends in the education of women scientists and engineers.

The meeting will be held at 8 p.m., Monday, Sept. 10, in the Community Hall of the Manhattan Beach Community Church.

Mrs. Anderson studied mechanical engineering at Iowa State and speech and English at UC at Berkeley. She contributed to the field of engineering during three and a half years with Space Technology Laboratories and one year with Aerospace as a technical assistant to engineers and scientists. She has also worked as a technical illustrator and technical writer.

Currently, she devotes much of her time to the chairmanship of the Los Angeles Section of the Society for Women Engineers of which she is a life member. The retired engineer has been a resident of Manhattan Beach for 12 years.

Mrs. Siegel has been in her field for 10 years. She is employed by Space Technology Laboratories as a member of the technical staff of the Inertial Guidance Dept. where she works on electric circuits, controls and guidance of missiles. She is professional guidance and education chairman of the Society of Women Engineers. While achieving her M.S. in electrical engineering at USC she received the Women's Badge in Tau Beta Pi, an all engineering honor society. She is a member of Eta Kappa Nu, an electrical engineering honor society, of I.R.E. and A.I.E.E.

The third member of this panel, Miss Jane Osuga, is currently a senior engineering student at U.C.L.A. This summer she is employed as a systems engineer by I.B.M. in Los Angeles where she is a programmer.
