C., for a free copy of their publication titled "Freedom From War." I am glad to report that the State Department is mailing this pamphlet free to everyone who requests it.

In the same column, I suggested that people write to Department of Defense, Office of Armed Forces Information and Education, Washington 25, D. C., and ask for a free copy of their publication titled "U. S. Foreign Policy in a New Age."

 "The following information is furnished in reply to your request for information on the pamphlet 'U. S. Foreign Policy in a New Age.'
 "This pamphlet appeared originally in October 1959 as Department of State Publication No. 6864, and was for sale by the superintendent of documents, Government Printing Office, but has now been declared obsolete and no copies are available.
 "The publication was distributed by this office to the armed forces for information but is no longer stocked.
 "We regret we cannot reply with your request."

ONE OF THE reasons I suggested that people write for these two free pamphlets is that many parents of young men in the armed forces have written to me that their sons were being indoctrinated with the idea that eventually the United States would disarm its national forces except those put under complete control of the United Nations.
 They complained that this indoctrination was sometimes given orally and at other times the two pamphlets mentioned above were given out to the men as required reading and then they were required to prove that they had read and understood the message contained in these two peculiar publications.

myself, obtained the two publications and was alarmed to find that when the two booklets are carefully studied there is only one conclusion and that is the present plan of the Administration in Washington, D. C., is to eventually turn over our armed forces to the United Nations.
 When I suggested that people write for pamphlets, I did this so that the citizens of the United States can see for themselves what is taking place. The fact that the Department of Defense now refuses to mail their pamphlet, "U. S. Foreign Policy in a New Age," to citizens and someone has forced the superintendent of documents, Government Printing Office, Washington 25, D. C., to stop selling it to the public, convinces me that there is something very, very wrong.

IF YOU HAVE not done so already, I suggest that you write to Department of State, Bureau of Public Affairs, Washington 25, D. C., for their free pamphlet, "Freedom From War."
 Because the Department of National Defense and the U. S. Government Printing Office have been ordered to not mail out "U. S. Foreign Policy in a New Age," I respectfully suggest that you write a letter to both U. S. senators and your own congressman, and say:
 "Please obtain for me the pamphlet, 'U. S. Foreign Policy in a New Age,' which the U. S. Government Printing Office will not sell and the Department of Defense will not mail to citizens. If you cannot send me this pamphlet, please tell me why its distribution to the public was

stopped and who ordered it banned."
 I SUGGEST that you write to U. S. Senator Thomas H. Kuchel and U. S. Senator Clair Engle, both at Senate Office Building, Washington 25, D. C., and that you also write to Congressman Alphonzo E. Bell Jr., Congressman Cecil R. King and Congressman Craig Hosmer. The address of all these congressmen is House Office Building, Washington 25, D. C.
 If they send you the pamphlet, by all means study it. If they send you a letter, even a form letter, please mail it to me because U. S. senators and members of the House of Representatives get so much mail that they do not have time to read all of it and must rely upon clerks.
 I cannot guarantee it, but I believe that either in the present session of the U. S. Congress or in the next session, there will be an investigation regarding these two pamphlets, particularly the one titled "U. S. Foreign Policy in a New Age."

Political Party Organizational Changes Studied

 Ask the average voter how his political party is organized, but don't be surprised at the scant, or even completely uninformed answer you get. He knows that there is such a thing as a county central committee, and also that there is a state central committee. Beyond that, he is usually at a loss, no matter how staunchly he expresses support of his party.

central committee. At present they are elected according to supervisorial or assembly districts. Continuation of this method was favored by 58 per cent of the Republicans, 39 per cent of the Democrats, but by only 7 per cent of the college professors. The three groups differed considerably when it came to changes from the present method. More than a third of the Democrats favored election from smaller districts, as did more than a fifth of the Republicans. Selection of members by small district conventions, or by party nominees received small support. Surprisingly, more than a quarter of the professors favored a combination of methods including election of some, nominee appointment of others, and representation from unofficial party groups.

But leaders in both major parties apparently want to remedy this situation and get party organization closer to individual voters, according to a recent legislative study. For the past year, the assembly interim committee on elections and reapportionment has been devoting the majority of its efforts to the need for political party reorganization through changes in the laws relating to such parties.

Methods of selecting state central committee members brought a different pattern of answers. Only 35 per cent of the Democrats and 27 per cent of the Republicans favored continuation of the present method of appointment by nominees. Here again, there was no substantial agreement as to alternatives between appointment by county committees, nominees or other groups. It is significant, however, that substantial majorities of both parties want some kind of a change.

AS TO SELECTION of delegates to the national conventions, about 40 per cent of both parties favor retaining the present election of state-wide slates named by the presidential candidates. Most favored alternative, named by about 25 per cent of both groups, was election of pledged delegates from each congressional district.

Opinions on the desirability of making local elections partisan was decided, to say the least, but not unanimous. More than two-thirds of the Democrats and professors favored party nominations of candidates for supervisor and city councilmen, and half also those for other county elective offices. Only 20 per cent of the Republicans favored such changes. All three groups voted against party elections for school boards, or boards of other special districts.
