

Chace to Oppose Enlarging Board

Los Angeles County voters will be getting "a pig in a poke" should they approve proposed enlargement of the Board of Supervisors to seven members, Supervisor Burton W. Chace declared yesterday.

Asserting his opposition to the ballot measure, Chace charged that there has been no need demonstrated, either by public demand, or requirements of government, to add two new supervisors.

"This would be a very costly

mistake," the Fourth District supervisor warned, pointing out that a majority of the board intends to join ranks of various civic groups to defeat the proposition.

"DESPITE RISING population in the area, city incorporations within the county actually have reduced the supervisors' work load," Chace said. "There has been absolutely no enthusiasm shown at the grass roots level that our citi-

zens would get any more, or any better representation from a larger board.

"But they will be getting more expensive government than need be," he asserted, citing newspaper editorials in opposition to the Charter Committee proposal to enlarge board membership to seven supervisors, each with office space and staff.

CHACE SAID he feels Los Angeles County citizens are

entitled to know how the present district would be re-aligned under such a program before they are asked to decide the issue.

"It is my opinion that residents of Los Angeles County are receiving a full measure of representation from the Board of Supervisors. Certainly there has been no great clamor for the proposed change — except possibly from persons desiring to become supervisors," Chace added.

To Appear at Area Church

County Studies Bids For Waleria Drains

Bids for construction of the proposed Waleria Lake storm drain have been opened by the county and are being evaluated by Flood Control engineers, according to Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Radco Construction Co. of Los Angeles has filed an apparent low bid of \$975,724.50 for construction of the local storm facility.

Three firms submitted proposals for the job to County Flood Control District Chief

Engineer M. E. Salsbury. The offer was \$1,091,313.40.

Chace said the contract, which is expected to be awarded shortly, includes construction of a retention basin, pump station, main line storm drain, and supporting fixtures.

Site of the basin and pump station is northwest of 238th Street and Hawthorne Boulevard. The main line will run from the pump station westerly in 238th Street to an existing drain at Madison Avenue, the supervisor added.

Flood Control District personnel will oversee construction, operation and maintenance of the facilities, which are expected to be put into service 12 months after work begins.

CHP Says Kids Back On Street
