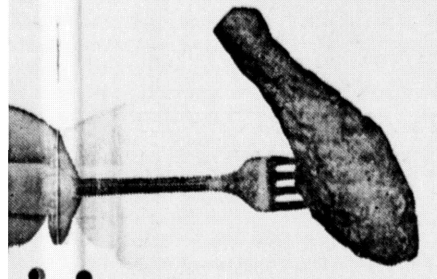


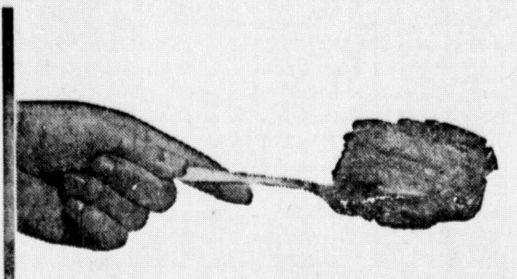

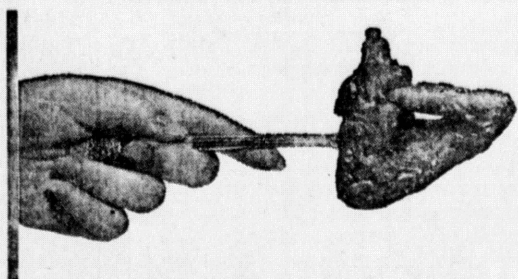

Bruinsma Calls For Bold Stand On Cuban Peril

An immediate military blockade of Cuba to enforce the Monroe Doctrine was vigorously urged this week by Ted Bruinsma, candidate for Congress, 17th District of California.

"The Russian buildup in Cuba is the most dangerous threat to the security of the United States since the outbreak of World War II," Bruinsma told a Torrance and Gardena citizens rally in North Torrance. "If I were in Congress at 9 a.m. this morning, by 9:30 I'd have a resolution in the hopper calling for immediate action by the President to preserve our safety while we still have the opportunity."

BRUINSMA called specifically for a three-point program: A blockade to prevent further shipment of Russian supplies and personnel to Cuba. A demand that our allies immediately cease transporting men and equipment into Cuba. An immediate meeting of the Organization of American States to formulate a joint program of security for the Western Hemisphere.

"WE HAVE been lectured that the Russian troops in Cuba are not troops, but mere military technicians. We have been assured that their presence is a danger to Latin America and that we should merely wait-and-see whether they are a danger to the United States.

"If the present Congressman would spend some time talking to the voters as I have done, he would find out that most people in the country can recognize the plain fact that Russians in Cuba are an immediate and direct danger to our entire missile program, and thus to the safety of our homes. There is no need to wait-and-see about that. There is a great need for firm leadership and effective action."

BRUINSMA, a veteran of both World War II and Korea, told the meeting that he finds local voters "far ahead of their present leadership in facing up to the realities of the Cuban threat and being ready to meet it."

"The people are going to make Cuba the key issue of the November elections," Bruinsma predicted. "It's too bad the present Congress and the Administration won't pay any attention to the wisdom of the people right now."

Invitations have been extended to civic leaders, service and fraternal clubs, youth groups, PTAs, and other organizations in the Torrance-Southwest area.
