RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, INTENDING TO VACATE A PORTION OF 236TH STREET IN THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, AND TO FIX A TIME AND PLACE FOR A HEARING THEREON, AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Torrance has decided to vacate a portion of 236th Street within the City of Torrance, more particularly described as follows, to wit: Those portions of Lots 17 and 18, Meadow Park Tract, as per map recorded in Book 15, Page 18 of Miscellaneous Records of said County, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the Easterly line of said Ocean Avenue, 40 feet wide, as said avenue existed on July 18, 1962, and the Northern line of 236th Street, 40 feet wide, as said street existed on July 18, 1962; thence Northwesterly along said Easterly line 40 feet; thence Southerly parallel to said Easterly line to the Southerly line of said street, thence Northwesterly along said Southerly line 530 feet to said Easterly line, thence Northerly along said Easterly line to the point of beginning;

WHEREAS, for the purpose of said proposed vacation the City Council wishes to proceed under the provisions of the Street Vacation Act of 1951 of the State of California (Chapter 256, Statutes of 1951, as amended);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.
That the City Council hereby declares its intention to vacate a portion of 236th Street, as more particularly shown upon a map bearing the legend "Map showing proposed vacation of a portion of 236th Street in the City of Torrance, which map is hereby approved for the purpose of this proceeding, and is hereby ordered filed in the Office of the City Clerk of Torrance and marked "Filed September 19, 1962" and which map is hereby referred to for particulars as to the proposed vacation.

SECTION 2.
The City of Torrance does reserve and except from the vacation as a permanent easement with the right at any time to construct, maintain, operate, replace, remove, renew and enlarge lines of conduits, cables, wires, poles, and other convenient structures, equipment and fixtures for the operation of electric, gas, telephone and other utility lines and for the transportation or distribution of electric energy, including access and protect the same from all hazards in, upon and over that portion of 236th Street proposed to be vacated, described as follows:

Parcel 1.
Beginning at the intersection of the Easterly line of said Ocean Avenue and the Northern line of said 236th Street; thence easterly along said Easterly line to a point of intersection with a line parallel with and distant 25.00 feet Westwesterly from the centerline of said 236th Street, said centerline being twenty-five (25) feet, measured at right angles, from the Westerly line of Hawthorne Avenue, 24 feet wide, as said avenue existed July 18, 1962; thence Southerly along said parallel line to the centerline of said 236th Street, said centerline being twenty-five (25) feet, measured at right angles, from the Northern line of said street; thence Northwesterly along said centerline to said Easterly line; thence Northerly along said Easterly line to the point of beginning.

Parcel 2.
Beginning at the intersection of the Northern line of said 236th Street and a line parallel with and distant 24 feet Westwesterly from the centerline of said 236th Street, from the Westerly line of Hawthorne Avenue, 24 feet wide, as said avenue existed July 18, 1962; thence Southerly along said parallel line to the Southerly line of said 236th Street; thence Northwesterly along said Southerly line to the point of intersection with a line parallel with and distant 25.00 feet Westwesterly from the centerline of said 236th Street, said centerline being twenty-five (25) feet, measured at right angles, from the Westerly line of Hawthorne Avenue; thence Northerly along said last mentioned parallel line to the Northern line of said street; thence Southerly along said Northerly line to the point of beginning.

SECTION 3.
That the 2nd day of October, 1962 at 5:30 p.m. of said day, in the Council Chambers of the City of Torrance, California, is the time and place fixed for hearing all persons interested in or objecting to the proposed vacation.

SECTION 4.
That the City Clerk is hereby directed to publish in the Torrance Herald, a newspaper of general circulation published in the City, one time at least ten days prior to the date of said hearing.

SECTION 5.
That the City Engineer is hereby directed to post conspicuously not less than four copies of this resolution not more than one hundred feet apart upon the boundaries of said land to be vacated.

Disabled Vets To Get Boost

Veterans Service Officer Mrs. Sara R. Bridges advised local veterans who receive disability compensation checks from the Federal Government not to be surprised by an increased amount on the checks received after Oct. 1. A new amendment to the code increases the monthly payment to disabled veterans.

According to Mrs. Bridges, President Kennedy recently signed Public Law 87-645, which provides for the increase, making it effective Oct. 1st.

Along with the normal increase, says Mrs. Bridges, the first check under the new amendment will include an additional lump sum payment equal to three times the monthly increase.
