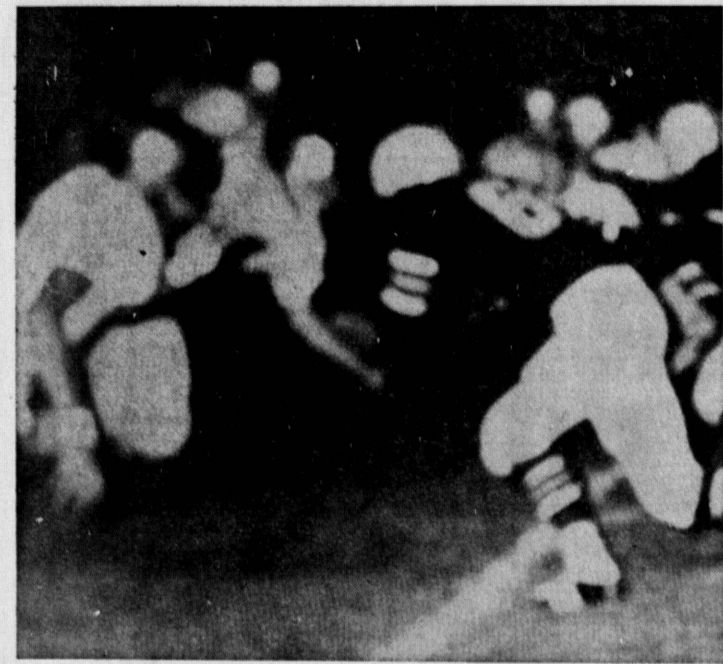


Saxons Nudge Warren Eleven

North Captures Opening Victory

Led by quarterback Norm Dow, North defeated Warren 10-0 on Saxon Field Friday in a non-league game before 2,000 people. Fumbles played an important part throughout the game. In the first quarter North fumbled while on an eventual 56-yard scoring. The Saxons promptly recovered the ball on the next play when Warren fumbled for the second time in the opening period.

THE ONLY six-point play of the game came when Dow, after taking the snap, pitched out to the left half Carey Hubert, who tossed a 31-yard pass into the waiting arms of right end Richard Bertoni.

Guard Richard Parker then kicked the extra point. In the fourth quarter Parker also contributed a 30-yard field goal.

THE SAME touchdown play was tried twice more. It was good for 36 yards and a new set of downs. The other time it was attempted it went Dow to Hubert to Ed Estrada, the left end. Estrada scored a touchdown, but the play was annulled by a 15-yard holding

penalty against the Saxons.

A strong defensive line and three interceptions by Richard Bertoni, Darl Wilson, and Carey Hubert highlighted the game.

TWO PASS interceptions and a second-half fumble proved to be Warren's downfall.

The fumble came in the third quarter when Ed Estrada crashed Warren's offensive line to tackle quarterback Walt Hale and recovered the ensuing fumble.

The Bears had a drive cut short late in the fourth quarter when Hubert intercepted a pass on the Saxons' 7-yard line. The same thing happened in the closing minutes of the half time when Bertoni intercepted a stray pass on the 4-yard line.

REDONDO AERIALS SANDBAG TARTARS

Unable to cope with the aerial wizardry of Bob Johnson, Torrance dropped a 19-7 decision to Redondo Friday in a non-league pigskin opener on the Seahawk's field. Torrance looked impressive at first, moving the ball fairly well and holding Redondo. Then Johnson took over from his quarterback position. With 3:20 left in the first quarter, the Seahawk signal caller teamed with Rick Eber on a 47-yard scoring play as Redondo grabbed a 6-0 lead.

A SERIES of breaks accounted for Redondo's second tally.

The Seahawks took over on the Tartar 43-yard line and went the distance in 15 plays. A pass interference penalty on a fourth down situation gave the Hawks the impetus they needed.

BILL PILI carried over from the one yard stripe with only 30 seconds left in the half. The Seahawks ran the conversion over to raise the count to 13-0. Less than one minute into the final quarter, Johnson again sparked the victors to a six pointer.

CAMPED ON his own 35 yard pass to Terry Nolan and Redondo was finished scoring for the evening.

A series of weird plays accounted for the sole Torrance TD of the night.

BRUCE HENDRIX started

the drive off for Torrance by recovering a Redondo fumble on the Tartar 40-yard stripe.

Three plays later, in a fourth down and punting situation, Mike Cicchine grabbed a direct snap from center and rambled 32 yards down the right sideline to give Torrance life.

FOLLOWING an incomplete pass, Harry Brown bulled up the middle for 10 more yards and a first down.

Willie Baker lost four yards attempting to go around left end.

TARTAR quarterback Howard Taylor hit Jim Coffman with a timely aerial to give THS a first down on the Redondo 12.

With 3:55 left in the game, Taylor zipped around right end, and fumbled, but Baker fell on the ball in the end zone and Torrance had scored its first touchdown of the 1962 season.

Jason Castillo kicked the conversion.

'Point-A-Minute' Sea Kings Blister Hapless West High

It is going to be a long season for West High.

Palos Verdes, using a potent ground game spiced with a quick-scoring aerial attack, laid its claim as a contender for the Pioneer League crown Friday, skunking West High, 51-0, in the opening grid contest for both squads.

Demonstrating their lack of experience, the Warriors were never a threat, and ventured into Sea King territory only late in the final period.

SENIOR FULLBACK Dave Olson was the main power in the Palos Verdes offense, driving across for four touchdowns, one a 50-yard jaunt.

Steve Moore, also running from the fullback position, galloped across the final chalkline twice for the Sea Kings.

JAY MACK and Bob Fiege

got in on the scoring honors with single six-pointers.

Beginning quickly, the eventual winners rammed home 12 points in the opening stanza, 13 tallies in the second quarter, and 19 markers in the third period.

ONLY ONE Sea King touchdown went on the scoreboard in the final quarter.

Stymied on offensive plays through the line, West was forced to move overhead with their attack and around the Palos Verdes flanks.

WHILE often-times the Warrior backs could turn the corners, speedy Sea King defense-men were always on the spot.

Typical of the Warrior trouble was the lack of team size. Top West quarterback Don Crane had trouble locating his receivers since he stands only 5-6.

Lack of line weight was evident as the bigger Palos Verdes line time and again opened gaping holes for the quicksilver Sea King backs.

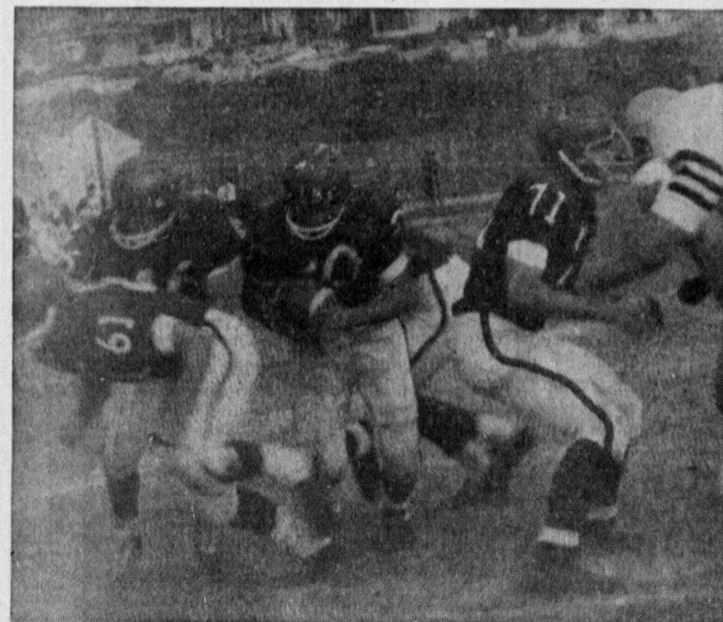
