

Sunday School Plans To Install Teachers

The Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church of Lomita will observe promotion day on Sunday in Sunday School and Training Union. The church has elected more than 100 people to work in the 22 departments of the Sunday School. This includes three adult departments and a department for married young people.

"More adults are enrolled in Southern Baptist Sunday Schools than any other denomination. As an example, of the 1,100 enrolled in our Sunday School, 450 are adults or married young people. There is a

department for every age, with more than one department for younger age groups." Pastor Robert A. Wells said.

The Sunday School workers will be installed and commissioned at the morning service by Sunday School Supt. Hugh Dooley. He will be assisted by Duke Argabright, assistant superintendent of training, and Nathaniel Riddle, assistant superintendent of visitation.

The Training Union will install its workers at the 7:30 p.m. service. Dell Vaughn, training union director, will recognize and commission those elected to serve in the 12 departments of the church training program.

The pastor's message at the 8:30 and 11 a.m. services will be "A Challenge from History."
