HOLLYWOOD — The regular weekly programs, most of which have now started their 39 week engagement in our living rooms, will probably runthe gamut from bad to very good. But TV's finest hours, the excellent presentations that bring excitement to television, will be the specials sprinkled liberally throughout the season.

There's much to look forward to this year in drama, music, public affairs and variety that should add a degree of distinction to the season.
