Sincere compassion and concern for the individual should be the motivation for the church's press for new members Tom O. Parish Sr., president of the National Evangelistic Assn. of the Christian Churches (Disciples of Christ), said in Los Angeles Saturday night.

"Our very function, as Christians, is to proclaim by life, word and deed the redemption which God has wrought for man, and man's responsibility to respond to His great love," he said in the final session of the NEA's annual two-day convention at the Biltmore Hotel.

H. Milton Sippell, minister of the First Christian Church of Torrance, opened the session with prayer.

Parish, minister of Central Christian Church in Wichita, Kans., said his conviction is that evangelism is the task of rescuing man in a highly industrialized and mobile society to the knowledge and acceptance of God's redemption.

Alondra Contract Awarded

Usona Construction Co. has been awarded \$120,979 contract for the general development of Alondra Park in Lawndale.

The Usona firm was the lowest of 11 bidders for the job. Bids were opened Sept. 12 and ranged to a high of \$159,000.

Work will center in the northeast section of the county park and will include the general development of approximately 10 acres.

SUPERVISOR Kenneth Hahn pointed out that the low bid is more than \$9,000 below the engineer's estimate for the project.

Development of the park will include new concrete sidewalks, chain link fencing, additional parking space for 84 cars, new sports facilities, development of an amphitheater, installation of an automatic sprinkler system and park lighting.

A new comfort station also will be constructed and a prefabricated steel shade shelter enclosing 960 square feet will be erected, Supervisor Hahn said.

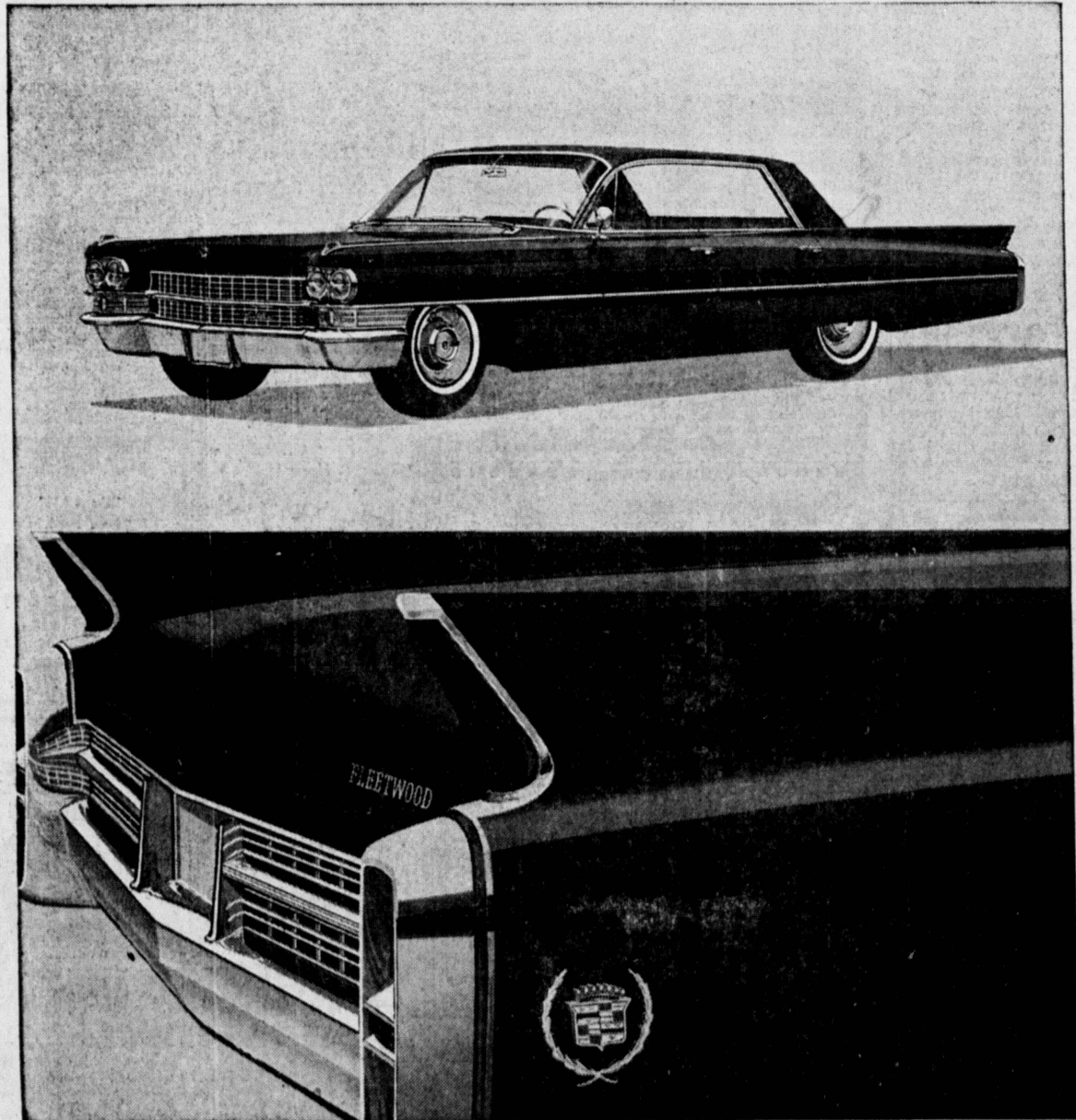
