## Kuchel Asks NATO Pact Allies To Recognize Communist Menace

Senator Thomas H. Kuchel has called upon North Atlantic Pact allies to broaden their view on the Communist menace and take a look at Soviet machinations in the Caribbean. The senior California senator made his plea as he was named a delegate to the NATO Inter-parliamentary Conference opening in Paris Nov. 12. Kuchel, who has attended four other NATO conferences, is the top-ranking Republican on the 14-man Senate team named by Vice President Johnson.

"It is foolhardy for those subscribing to the North Atlantic Treaty to blind themselves to diabolic Soviet machinations in the Caribbean while holding up collective shields against Communist threats on

the European continent," Senator Kuchel declared. He said he hoped the U. S. delegation could drive home the point that the responsibilities of the treaty organization embrace the western shores of the ocean as well as the eastern.

**THE TEXT** of his statement follows:

"In view of the deplorable continuing world tensions, some of which have mounted rather than diminished during the past year, this Paris conference will be of even greater importance than those I attended in the past.

"Berlin, of course, will be a top priority problem but the meeting affords this country a chance to ask our North At-

lantic allies to take a broader view of the Communist threat. Specifically, the time has come to face up to the Soviet salami tactics on our side of the Atlantic, as undeniably shown by developments in Cuba.

"IN DISCUSSIONS with fellow legislators from the other signatory countries, I trust the U. S. delegation will be able to drive home the very salient point that attempted Communist aggression in any hemisphere is of concern to all freedom-loving peoples and the responsibilities of the treaty organizations embrace the western shores of the ocean equally with the eastern.

## Young Cellist Slates Symphony Performance

The Beach Cities Symphony, directed by Composer-Conductor Louis Palange, will appear in the first concert of the 13th season Friday at 8:15 p.m. at the Mira Costa High School Auditorium in Manhattan Beach. Included in the program will be Rienze Overture by Richard Wagner, Norwegian Rhapsody No. 3 by Svendsen, Finlandia by Sibelius, and Concerto for Cello and Orchestra by Haydn.

Featured as soloist in the latter offering will be young Peter Snyder of Santa Monica. Peter, who was born in Brooklyn 18 years ago, began his musical career at the age of three when his mother, a concert pianist and organist, began teaching him. His family moved to Los Angeles in 1947 where he grew up and was graduated from high school under a special educational program sponsored by the Los Angeles Conservatory of Music and Art where he is presently in his sophomore year of college under the same scholarship plan.
