As more of the poison is inhaled, nausea and vomiting and mental confusion may occur, and muscular coordination specifically the ability to move, isimpaired. Loss of consciousness will follow unless the victim is removed from the environment.

THE SEVERITY of the symptoms depends to a great extent on the total amount of carbon monoxide that is inhaled. Breathing a little over a long period of time may be just as serious as a high concentration over a short time. This means the serious in the lementary school.
