NOTICE is hereby given that pursuant to the Improvement Act of 1911, Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code and Resolution No. 62-221 of the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, authorizing the construction of certain curbs, gutters and sidewalks to be done or improvement to be made which is described in Resolution of Intention, Resolution No. 62-182, passed by the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, and will be taken as herein provided for the construction of:

THE IMPROVEMENT OF 229TH STREET FROM ARLINGTON AVENUE TO CYPRESS STREET (STREET ASSESSMENT DISTRICT A-11-61-3) PER CITY OF TORRANCE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT PLAN NO. ST-88

The proposals or bids for said work shall be sealed and delivered to and filed with the City Clerk of the City of Torrance in the City Hall of said city located at 3001 Torrance Boulevard, not later than 1:30 P. M. Wednesday, October 31, 1962. The City Engineer shall, in public session, in the Council Chambers in said city publicly open, examine and declare the same at 2:30 P. M. on said day, which is the time herein fixed for the opening of said proposals or bids. The City Engineer will cover the cost of furnishing all labor, material and equipment for the improvement of the above-mentioned district by the complete construction and installation therein of curbs, gutters and sidewalks together with all other items of work incidental or appurtenant thereto, as described in Resolution of Intention No. 62-182, adopted August 14, 1962, by the City Council of said City. For further instructions to bidders and other particulars, and for a full and complete description of reference is hereby made to the said Resolution of Intention and to the following documents on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City:

Any errors in extension or additions shall be corrected and the total bid price shall be adjusted in accordance therewith. Any alteration of or addition to the form of the proposal which qualifies the bid will invalidate same.

All bidders must be licensed in accordance with the provisions of the Business and Professions Code, as amended.

The City Council reserves the right to reject any or all bids or waive any informality, technical error, or discrepancy on a bid, to the extent permitted by law, if said action is deemed to be advantageous to the City.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish surety bonds satisfactory to the Superintendent of Streets in an amount of not less than fifty percent (50%) of the amount of the bid as a guarantee of the faithful performance of the Contract, and in an amount of not less than fifty percent (50%) of the amount of the bid as a guarantee of all labor and materials used in the performance of the Contract.

BIDDERS ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED, that said City Council by Resolution No. 62-35 adopted March 27, 1962, has ascertained and determined the general prevailing rate per diem wages and the general prevailing rate for legal holiday and overtime work in the locality in which said work is to be performed for each craft or type of workman needed to execute the contract for said work. For further particulars, reference is hereby made to said Resolution No. 62-35 on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City.

It shall be mandatory upon the Contractor to whom a Contract is awarded, and upon all Subcontractors under him, to pay not less than said general prevailing rates of per diem wages to all workmen employed in the execution of the Contract.

All of the aforesaid work and the proceedings therefor shall be done under and in pursuance of the Improvement Act of 1911, Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code.

The time within which the aforesaid work must be completed by the Contractor undertaking the same has been fixed at twenty-five (25)
