Diplomacy by Poet Scored by Bruinsma

Ted A. Bruinsma, candidate from the 17th District, yesterday charged that the State Department is conducting "foreign policy by poet." He cited the recent secret message which 88-year-old poet Robert Frost carried from President Kennedy to Khrushchev and a return message brought back by Frost from the Russian leader.

Bruinsma quoted from a newspaper column by George Dixon, writer for the Washington Post, which pointed out that Frost was briefed by W. W. Rostow, special assistant to President Kennedy and principal architect of the "no-

win" policy, before going to Russia.
BRUINSMA said Frost recited a poem he had written entitled "Mending the Wall." He pointed out that the chief theme of the poem was that "good fences make good neighbors." The candidate asserted that perhaps this was the New Frontier's way of suggesting to Khrushchev that we are really not concerned about the Berlin Wall.

"Foreign policy by poet is not my idea of insuring our future security," Bruinsma declared.
