### Plans to Expand Hospital Pediatrics Space Revealed

Plans were revealed to expand the pediatrics department of the Little Company of Mary Hospital at the Advisory Board meeting held Thursday evening.

Dr. Matthew P. Romero, chief of staff, urged the Advisory Board to take the necessary steps to increase capacity of the pediatrics department by 26 beds to accommodate the growing demands of the community on the hospital.

Dr. Romero pointed out that the pediatrics department originally started with 15 beds and has already been increased to 22 beds. The department has been operating in excess of 100 per cent of capacity for several months, and he requested that it be increased by 26 beds to 48 beds.

Advisory Board President

George W. Schneider appointed Sam Levy, Edward P. Greene, and E. J. Champion as a committee to assist the hospital in the proposed enlargement.

Advisory Board members Gene Alfred and Don Reining reported on new administrative procedures. They were requested to meet with the executive committee of the medical staff for an exchange of views.

The following appointments to the Third Annual Founders' Day Dinner committee were made: William R. Burke, program; James Viscaglia, arrangements; E. J. Champion, reservations. The exact date for the dinner has not been established but it is anticipated that the dinner will be held in late January or early February.

### Local Men Aid Storm Repair Crew

Five Redondo Beach men were among a group of 35 Southern California Edison Co. repair specialists who were flown to Portland to help hard-pressed Northwest utility companies restore electric service in the storm disaster area, it was announced by L. E. Jenkins, Edison district manager.

The Redondo Beach contingent, flown to Portland aboard a U.S. Air Force Globemaster, included Milo Hutchenson, Clarence Braly, Allen Allred, Bill Phillips, and Craig Reade.

Twenty-five of the Edison linemen, carrying their own tools and equipment, were loaded aboard the Globemaster to assist Pacific Power and Light Co. in the storm emergency. A second flight of 10 additional Edison linemen followed on a commercial airliner to lend a hand to Portland General Electric Co., which serves an adjoining area.

The Edison linemen—led by Oliver P. Roemer, general superintendent of the company's operating department—were dispatched in prompt response to an appeal from the Northwest power companies for assistance from utilities in neighboring states.
