## Area Leaders Fete Gibson

John S. Gibson, for 10 years a Los Angeles city councilman from San Pedro, eight of which he served as Council president, was given a non-partisan testimonial luncheon Monday by more than 60 Torrance and South Bay officials and community leaders in Manhattan Beach, marking the closing phase of his campaign for County Assessor.

In introducing the assessor candidate, County Supervisor Burton Chace praised Gibson's life of public service and predicted a sweeping victory for him at the polls Tuesday, Nov. 6. He emphasized Gibson's proved integrity during his many years of public service.

In response, Candidate Gibson declared he could make no promises of lower taxes if he was elected.

"I will promise," he said, "that I will make every effort

to employ every means at hand to increase the efficiency in every department and bend every effort to see that every one of the more than 1,750,000 parcels of real estate in Los Angeles County are fairly appraised."

Western. He set up a glide path and headed in a north-west direction. After passing over Western Avenue Baxter
