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

# **Rose Seeks** Changes in Vote Count

In a campaign lasting more than 10 months, and covering more than 30,000 miles, Don Rose, the Democratic nominee for Secretary of State, has car-ried his state-wide campaign into hundreds of California communities in an effort to wrest the lone state constitu-tional office now held by a Republican from the incumbent.

Rose has charged that the present Secretary of State, the chief election officer of California, has permitted our election procedures to become so outdated and inefficient that California's long slow vote counts are notorious throughout the nation. "After this year's June 5th

election it took 49 days—15 days past the statutory limit set in the Elections Code—to report the vote, the longest, slowest count in California history," Rose maintained. Rose has repeatedly com-mended the work of local poll-

ing place officials "who work diligently under incredibly difficult conditions to count and report our vote."
