RN Camp Will Serve Dinner

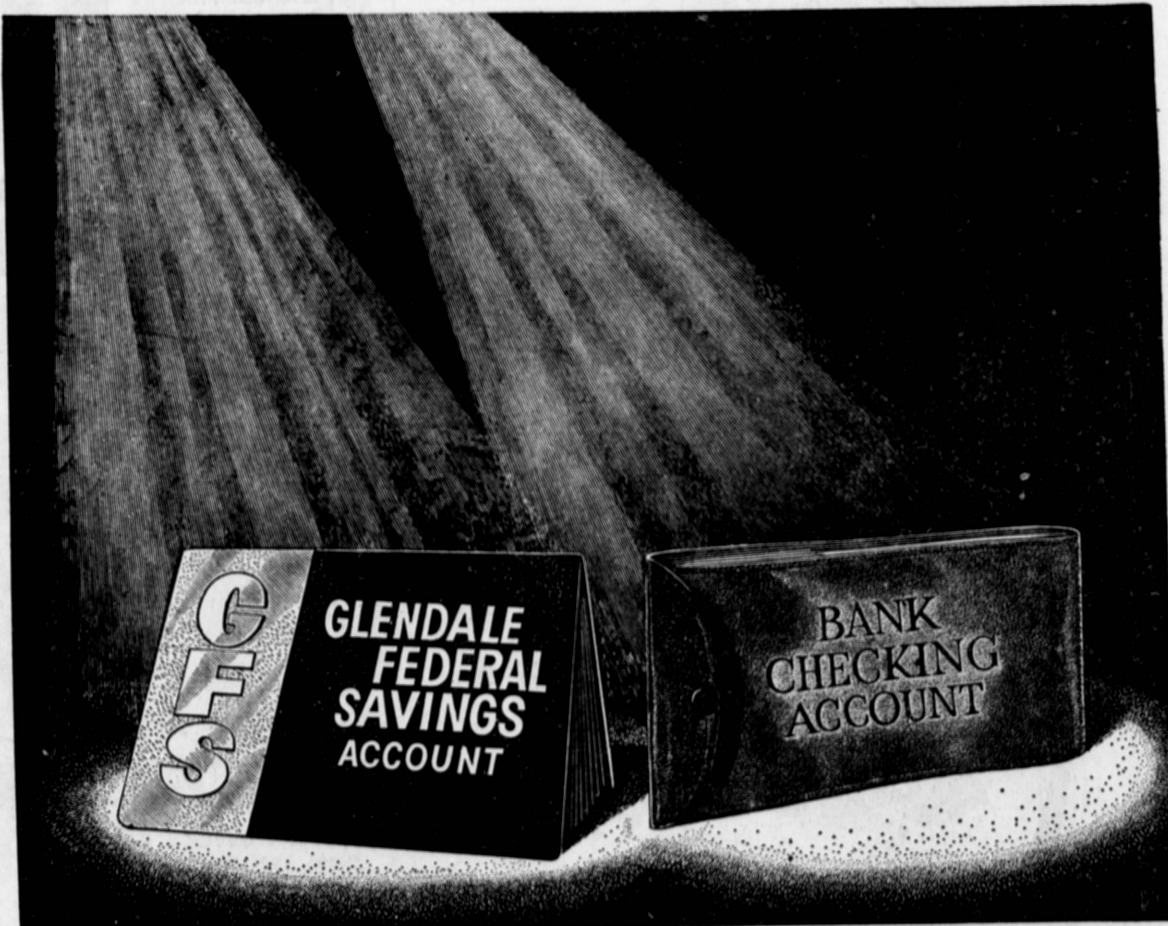
