Davis, district manager, the opening of the new service office in Torrance resulted from the in-creasing volume of Social Se-curity business incident to the rapid expansion of industry and population in the area. In addition to the city of Tor-rance, the office also serves Gardena, Harbor City, Hermosa Beach, Lawndale, Lomita, Man-hattan Beach, Palos Verdes Es-tates, Redondo Beach, Rolling
