

Business Level At Near Record

Southern California's business activity during October performed at a near record level, showing only a nominal change from the previous months, H. P. Atherton Jr., manager of Security First National Bank's Torrance branch, reported yesterday.

Despite running approximately 9.5 per cent over the year-ago period, Atherton said there was some evidence of slowness in certain segments of the local economy.

Based on figures for the week ending Oct. 20, Security's business index stood at 124.2 (preliminary), compared with 122.8 (adjusted) in September.

AS EVIDENCED by additional statistics for the months of the third quarter, it appears that the Southland's economy may have reached its peak in August (125.0), Security said.

Yet, overall business activity has continued to fare strongly in September and in October.

Strongest segment in the local business picture for the month was department store sales. After declining in the last part of September, volume recorded in the first three weeks of October registered a vigorous advance.

month's activity was given by a high volume of building activity. Normal seasonal factors considered, it marked the fourth month building activity has risen.

Volume of electric power sales to industry, a series which hit a peak in June, was one of the factors that showed signs of weakness, Security noted.

A decline in the volume of commercial bank clearings, a component that reached a record in August, also was reported.

In addition, declines in the number of help wanted ads appearing in the Los Angeles area newspapers were recorded. The latter index has declined in each month since May, Security said.

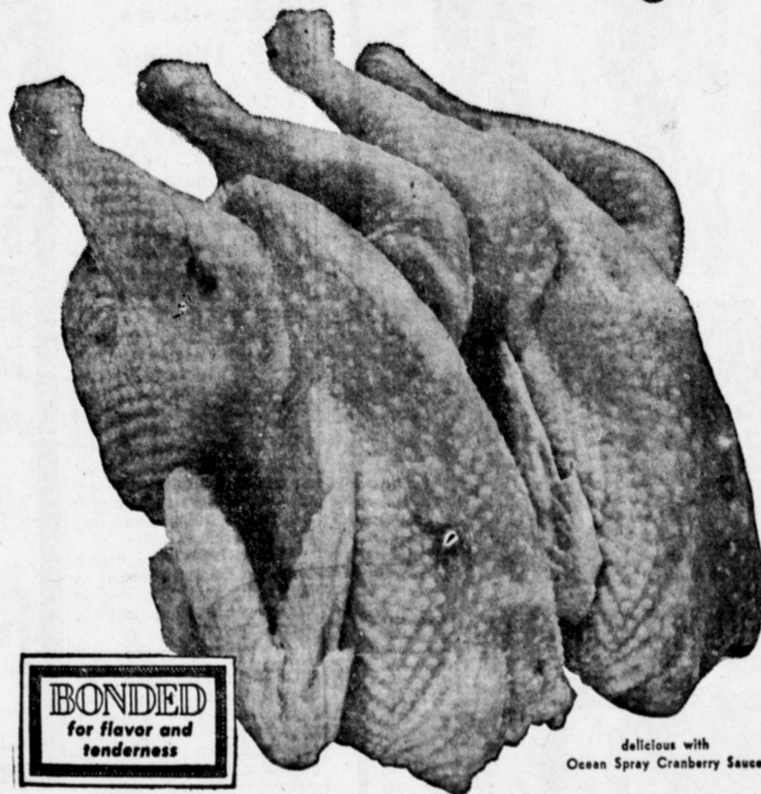

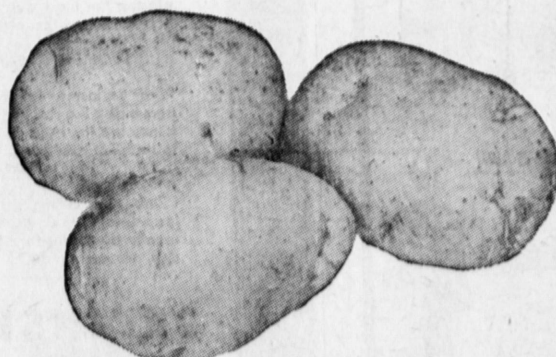
