

Hahn Calls for County Fallout Shelter Project

After conferring with top civil defense officials on the federal, state and local level, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn urged construction of a county-wide fallout shelter to protect the nearly 7 million people of Los Angeles County in case of nuclear attack.

Hahn is vice-chairman of the civil disaster committee of the County Supervisors Assn. of California.

He spoke with William Durkee, head of the local government section, Federal Office of Civil Defense; Allan K. Jonas, director of the California Disaster Office, and Supervisor Lewis Nelson of Santa Cruz

County, chairman of the civil disaster committee of the CSAC.

WORKING PLANS for Hahn's shelter program in Los Angeles County have been prepared for more than a year.

He introduced the plan for a multi-purpose shelter be-

neath the grounds of each of the 1600 schools in Los Angeles County early in the Berlin crisis.

In discussing challenges posed to local civil defense by the Cuban crisis, Hahn asked Durkee if there are military funds available to local jurisdictions on a loan or matching

basis to build fallout shelters.

(The County Supervisors Assn. of California, on Hahn's motion, recommended in January that President Kennedy and Congress "establish a ratio of 50 per cent federal, 35 per cent state and 15 per cent local" funding for fallout shelters.)

DURKEE SAID he would bring the matter to the proper Department of Defense officials.

Hahn also urged that Durkee have the federal government's pamphlet, "Fallout Protection" distributed by mail to every home in America.

THE PAMPHLET, published late in 1961, has been made available to citizens at post offices, but they must pick them up.

"As long as there is a Soviet

Union bent on ruling the world," the supervisor said, "our children and grandchildren will live under threats and crises."

"We must pray and work for peace," he said, "but we must be prepared for war."

HAHN CITED President Kennedy's words in his major address on Monday:

"... the greatest danger of all would be to do nothing."

"Now that the situation in Cuba has emerged as a grave

crisis, the federal government is, rightfully, most concerned with meeting the threat of the Cuban missiles," Hahn said. "It is time for local government to assume the lead in civil defense... protection of our people so they can rise from any disaster and fight back."

"Los Angeles County cannot build missiles; it cannot conduct military maneuvers, but it can build fallout shelters," he stressed.

Hahn said high-level Pentagon officials have said Los An-

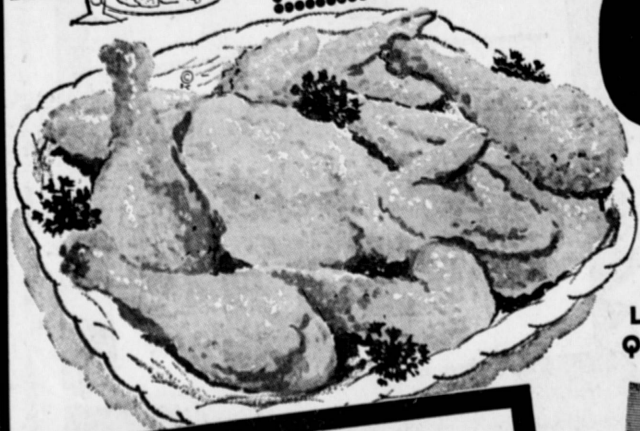
