Fred Mill Thanks Chest Volunteers

Fred Mill, Harbor Area chairman for the current 1962-63 Community Chest campaign, has thanked volunteers of eight cities for a major award he now holds for top organization among the Chest's eight campaign areas.

The award is the prized Morrell Trophy, given each year to the area having the highest percentage of organization. To date the Harbor Area has 5,288 of 5,554 needed workers or 95.21 per cent.

Mill, at the regular meeting of the Harbor Area Community Chest board of directors held last week at the AFL-CIO Retail Clerks' Hall in Lomita, also reported current city and area standings in the fundgetting campaign to raise \$106,900 for 155 Community Chest member-agencies.
