College Play Presented On Revolving Stage

In the production of "Who Was That Lady I Saw You With?" El Camino students are using a revolving stage. The play will have its third and fourth presentation tomorrow and Saturday, 8:30 p.m., in the Campus Theater.

A technically elaborate production, containing a variety of scenes from an apartment house to a Chinese restaurant, Norman Kraska's script calls for eight different sets. Two circular, revolving platforms are used to provide these.

Each of the platforms is divided in half while the two front halves of the platform are being used, the stage crew sets up the next scene in the back. This allows the actors to change scenes quickly. It takes about 15 seconds to change from one stage set to another. Dennis Morgan is the star of the comedy. Others in the cast are Jeanne Appel, Ann Wil-

liams; Ron Quint, Harry Powell; Pat Roney and Sally Slater, the Coogle sisters; Jerry Olivere and Len Van Pelt, two foreign agents.
