

# Ascot Sets 'Biggest' Program

More racing cars than have ever taken a Southern California track will compete this weekend for the World Open Competition championship at Ascot Park.

Racing will be held tomorrow and Saturday and will begin at 8:15 each evening. Champions from six states will compete in the program which features a \$4025 purse and \$1,000 guaranteed to the winner of the 100-lap main event on Saturday.

THE RACE, which is open to all types of cars, including sprint cars, midgets, super-modifieds, sportsman, stock cars, hot rods, and the new flying wings, will pit over 150 autos against each other in the two nights of racing. Frank Secrist, champion at his home town track in Bakersfield, will head the list of drivers.

SECRETIST HAS turned the 2½ mile high-banked track at Daytona Beach, Florida, at a record 155.911 miles per hour, faster than Parnelli Jones, Indianapolis qualifying record-holder. Joining Secrist are Oregon champion Art Pollart, Nevada champ Don Riggins, Ted Jones, Arkansas titleholder, Bill

White, Texas champion, and San Diego titleholder Dick Fries.

## Seahawks Attempt Recovery From Worst Licking Ever

Battered and bruised from its worst football licking in history, Harbor College finishes its Western State Conference campaign against host Compton on Saturday at 8 p.m. Conference-leading Glendale, undefeated following a loss in the first game of the year, handed Harbor a fantastic 80-0 licking on Friday.

The Glendale game was over for the Seahawks almost before it had begun. The big blow fell when Ray Jones, Harbor's main offensive weapon and a big share of the defense, was ejected from the game for fighting.

JONES HAD NOT even run one offensive play before he was thumbed out. It was a rough game, marked by minor skirmishes and penalties. Harbor received eight penalties for 86 yards and Glendale earned 18 penalties for 201 yards.

WITH JONES OUT, Myron Van Wey took over the quarterbacking duties, but injuries kept him out for the second half. Halfback Jack Brokenbaugh ran the team after intermission from a spread formation.

Ron Renison led the Vaqueros by gaining 231 yards at

a 12.2 average clip. Renison netted four touchdowns in guiding Glendale to its 537 net yards. Harbor was only able to pile up 88 yards during the contest.

MATTERS DO NOT get any easier for the Hawks this weekend. Although Compton has won only two Western State games, it has been involved in some wild, high-scoring contests.

The Tartars' latest was a 41-32 non-conference loss to Phoenix. Joe Rodriguez led Compton with four touchdowns in that contest and once again will be the host's top offensive threat.
