

# Special Session 'Calls' In Hands of the Governor

Normally, the long general session of the California State Legislature begins on the first Monday in January of an odd-numbered year, such as 1963. The first Monday of 1963 is Jan. 7, and that is when we expect to convene. Legislators leave home and go to Sacramento a few days in advance in order to organize their offices, hence all mail to members of the Assembly or State Senators should be addressed to the State Capitol, Sacramento 14, Calif., after Jan. 1.

Because of the tense international situation, the Governor of the State of California can exercise his authority to call the Legislature into Special Session at any time and on very short notice. When the governor issues what is technically known as a "Call" for a Special Session, he states in broad, general terms the subjects which will be on the agenda, but he does not specify the numbers or authors of the bills to be considered.

WHEN THE Governor calls a Special Session and lists the subjects on the agenda, he can later add other subjects for the Special Session. A Special Session can be "called" at any time, but if it is "called" during the long, regular General Session of 1963, or the short, Budget Session of an even-numbered year (such as 1962, 1964, etc.), the Special Session runs concurrently with the General Session or the Special Session, as the case may be. In other words, in 1963, the Governor can bring us to Sacramento ahead of Jan. 7 if he wishes and he can announce a Special Session to run concurrently with the General Session of 1963, which normally should end about June 15.

However, if there is a Special Session running concurrently with the long General Session of 1963 and if we do not complete the work of the Special Session by the day the General Session must end in accordance with the State Constitution, we must remain in session in Sacramento until the Special Session agenda is finished.

THE ABOVE statements may seem involved and complicated but they are correct and apply regardless of who is Governor. Briefly, I believe we shall go into the General Session on Jan. 7 and adjourn to come home about the middle of June, but not being a fortune-teller, I must admit that anything can happen during a tense situation.

You have strong ideas about laws that should be enacted, and laws that should be repealed. In order to help legislators carry out your wishes, please write to us, stating very specifically what you want or do not want. These recommendations of yours should be sent to your own Assemblyman and also to your own State Senator.

IT HELPS us give you faster and better service if you have each suggestion typed on a separate piece of paper, retain a carbon copy for yourself, and send up by mail the original and one carbon copy. The reason for the typewritten suggestions is that they are more legible than penmanship, thus reducing the possibility of error. We need an original and one copy because we send the original to the Legislative Counsel to prepare the bill (potential law) and put the carbon copy in a file folder.

Separate ideas should be on

separate sheets of paper because we open a file for each idea. When we receive more than one suggestion or recommendation on one piece of paper, it must be copied in order to open the necessary number of files. This may seem like "red tape," but that is the way government operates.

If you cannot have your ideas typed, you will get the same attention as those who send typed ideas, but it requires more time. Even a postal card with a message in pencil is read and answered. A telegram which includes your full name and address is answered very soon, but if it does not contain your address, we must have the telephone directories searched, thus delaying service to you.

IF YOU FIND an idea in a newspaper which you like or dislike, please cut out the story and send it with the name and date of issue of the newspaper. The same applies to magazine articles, but in either case please say whether you agree or disagree and why. Local newspapers published in or near your own community often have stories or articles which pertain to important local issues which are not important enough for the large metropolitan newspapers to discuss at length.

My personal advice is to subscribe to at least one local paper and also at least one of the two large metropolitan Los

Angeles newspapers. Actually, I take both of the large metropolitan newspapers in addition to all local newspapers.

IN ACCORDANCE with the State Constitution and the U. S. Constitution, the California Legislature can enact only laws of application within the state. Almost everyone knows this, but we receive a surprisingly large number of letters telling us how to vote on federal laws. We write to the senders of such letters and recommend that they write to the two U. S. senators from California and their own congressman. Until Jan. 1, all mail should be sent to me at P. O. Box 327, Redondo Beach. After Jan. 1, mail should be sent to me at Room 4001, Assembly Chambers, State Capitol, Sacramento 14, Calif.
