Sears Gives \$10,000 to Assist USC

The first California gift in a new, nationwide Sears, Roebuck and Co. program of aid to private colleges and universities was made Monday to the University of Southern California.

Presentation of the gift, amounting to \$10,000, was made by J. G. Lowe, Sears' Los Angeles retail group manager, to Dr. Norman Topping, USC president.

A total of 48 private, independent colleges and universities in California are sharing in a total of \$63,300 in Sears giving this year. Twenty-nine of these institutions are in the Los Angeles area.

schools to allocate the funds to their greatest needs.

Stanford University also receives \$10,000, adding that the USC and Stanford gifts are for the maximum amounts allowable under the provisions of the Sears program.

Commenting on the Sears program, Lowe added a plea for greater corporate giving to private higher education. "This must increase from its current level of about \$200 million to \$500 million by the end of this decade if these schools are to discharge properly their educational obligations to American society," Lowe said. "Sears expects to continue its new program as long as business con-

ditions permit."

In addition to the company's aid to education, another \$700,000 has been given this year to institutions of higher learning

by the Sears-Roebuck Foundation, the non-profit corporation endowed by Sears to carry on charitable, scientific and educational programs.

Beasley Appointed To Advisory Council

J. A. Beasley, owner of the Beasley Insurance Agency and city councilman, has been appointed by the Board of Supervisors to the Citizen's Advisory Committee on Community Improvement. His appointment will be effective Jan. 1, and will run for one year.

The purpose of the Citizens Advisory Committee is to advise and assist the Board of Supervisors in planning and developing the county's construction program.

Beasley's appointment was recommended to the board by Burton W. Chace, supervisor.

DMV Issuing New Plates This Month

New 1963 license plates are being issued this month by the Department of Motor Vehicles to limited groups of vehicle owners.

Tom Bright, director of the department said owners of commercial trucks, trailers and other vehicles used commercially may obtain new plates in December through Feb. 4, 1963. He urged owners of these vehicles to renew early and avoid the normal renewal period crowds between Jan. 2 and Feb. 4, 1963.

"We are authorized by law to issue 1963 plates to persons who acquire vehicles by transfer in December," Bright said.

NEW CARS purchased during December are also eligible for new plates if purchasers desire. "This spares the purchaser of double transactions—one transaction when acquiring the vehicle and another during the normal renewal period next month," Bright said.

DMV mailed more than one million registration renewal cards this month to commercial truck, trailer, and taxi owners. Cards may be presented at local DMV offices or mailed with registration fees to receive 1963 plates. Applications for commercial vehicles cannot be processed at bank stations which will operate from Jan. 2 to Feb. 4 to process passenger car renewals only.

BRIGHT reminded dealers, wreckers, manufacturers, and transporters that their applications for 1963 registrations were due Nov. 30. Delinquent applications will be charged an \$8 penalty on the first set of plates. Licenses of these firms will expire Dec. 31 if renewal applications are not received. Bright warned. This would necessitate original fees and the usual processing delay for a new license before business could be resumed.
