Happiness, contentment, peace of mind, or whatever else it may be called, is a thing that grows, or emanates, from within the individual. It is elo-quent of a capacity to meet the stresses of life and also of an ability of rise above the an-noyances, petty and otherwise, that seem to occur without end in day-to-day living.

NOR DOES this imply acceptance of the irresponsible mentality that refuses to recognize the existence of these conditions when they do exist. This is really just a form of emotional immaturity since it shows a reluctance to face reality.

Law In Action

The 1962 election ballot saw

The 1962 election ballot saw many proposals to amend the California constitution which, unlike the U. S. constitution, is a mass of many laws. Many people regard it as too long.

California adopted its first constitution in 1849 and revised it in 1879. The earlier constitution restricted the state's powers and set out broad principles.

THE STATE constitution now goes further. For example among other things it (1) re-serves for the people the right to fish in state waters; (2) sets up a state civil service law; (3) restricts the use of gas and highway tax money for roads; and (4) establishes the University of California.

New provisions are pre-sumed to be "self-executing" and go into effect without leg-

The constitution also has several "enabling" provisions: They allow law makers to pass laws in certain fields such as workmen's compensation law, set up a public utilities commission, or a special kind of tax system. tax system.

State amendments are pro-posed by a two-thirds vote of the State Legislature, or by an initiative petition signed by eight per cent of the voters at the last state election. To become law amendments must be ratified by a majority vote of the voters.

DO NOT confuse initiative with referendum. A referendum measure starts when the Legislature refers a law to the people for their approval. The initiative starts with the people who petition to put it on the ballot.

The State constitution declares rights much the same as the federal constitution. In addition the 14th amendment in the U. S. constitution also gives citizens the protection of the federal bill of rights.
