(Continued from Page 1) first real difference. Also Ari commented it is customary to have a big supper which generally begins at 10 o'clock. Afterwards, all the family and the relatives sing Christmas songs in front of the "Nacimiento," the nativity scene which is placed on a table.

Christmas day is usually celebrated by a big dinner of turkey and all the dressing and the special dessert and drink, turron and champagne.

Feasts Not Unusual It seems all the Spanish do during the holiday is eat and on "La Noche Vieja," the Old Night, Dec. 31, another supper is given. It is not unusual to have so many feasts, as they usually eat four times a day anyway.

On the last night of the year firecrackers light the sky as the new year noisily rolls in and small rockets filled with candies are set off in the houses. Besides this, the usual number of parties are given to celebrate the beginning of another year.

IT'S AT THIS TIME that we usually make resolutions to make the new year better than the last. In Spain people are given 12 grapes which are to be eaten one by one at every stroke of the clock. If a person can do it, and according to Ari, few can, then he is supposed to have good luck for the new year. But as Ari puts it, "It's just a custom!"
