Leets entered the Army in June, 1962, and received basic training at Fort Ord.

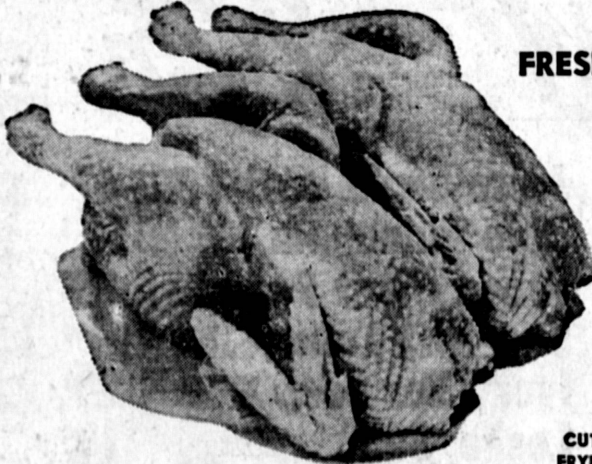
Before entering the Army, he was employed by the Continental Airlines, Los Angeles International Airport.

EASY CHICKEN TETRAZZINI. If you like chicken, then you're sure to like this dish, since it combines simplicity of ingredients with the glamor of something a little bit different from fried or broiled poultry. Place in a deep kettle 1 large fryer or 3 pounds fryer parts, 1 cup celery leaves, 1 large sliced onion and 1 teaspoon salt. Just barely cover with water and bring to a rolling boil, then reduce heat and simmer for 1 hour, until meat easily falls off bones. Remove chicken and discard all skin, and bone, then strain the liquid and save all broth and meat for use later. Melt 1/4 cup butter in a sauce pan and lightly brown in it 1/4 pound fresh mushrooms. Blend into the browned mushrooms 1/2 cup flour, stirring well to mix, then add 2 cups of the reserved broth and 3 tablespoons cooking sherry. Cook, stirring until smooth and medium thick, then add 1 cup light cream, 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper. In boiling salted water, cook 8 ounces spaghetti, according to package directions. Drain well. In a buttered 1 1/2 quart casserole dish, place a little of the mushroom sauce, then a layer of cooked spaghetti, then a layer of cooked cut-up chicken, then more sauce; repeat again, ending with sauce. Over the top of the casserole sprinkle 1/2 cup shredded sharp Cheddar cheese and bake in a 400° oven for 20 minutes, until top is bubbly. Add a green salad and a tart cherry dessert and the meal is table-ready. Makes 5-6 ample portions.

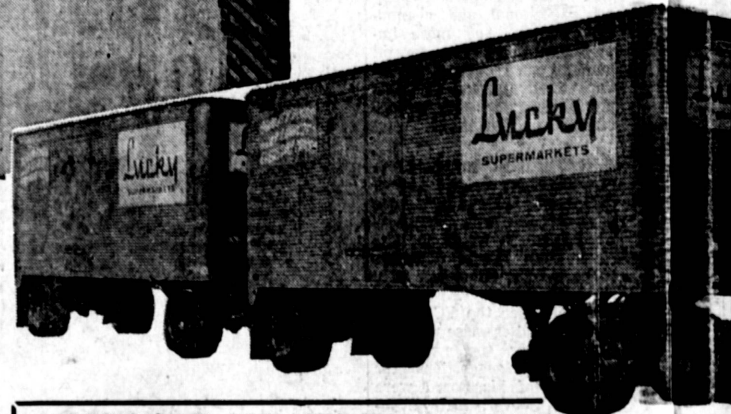
