

Southwest Obedience Club Donates \$1,750 to Blind

The Southwest Obedience Club goes over the top again with a repeat donation of another guide dog for a blind person.

This year, as in 1962, the club contributed the sum of \$1,750, which is the approximate cost of a man-dog team from the guide dogs, to the blind at San Rafael, Calif.

This is the 10th year the Southwest Club has donated to this worthy organization; and recently, December, 1962, John Russell Holmes, San Rafael's representative in the Los Angeles area, presented a "first of its kind" plaque to the club

commemorating their "dedicated service."

The occasion for the monetary award, the largest sum ever given by a dog club in the United States for a philanthropic cause, will be Feb. 16, 7 p.m., at the annual installation-award dinner at the Elks Club in Inglewood.

ATTENDING THE dinner from Guide Dogs will be William F. John, executive director, and Mrs. Pierpont Morgan Hamilton, president of the board of trustees.

Holmes will accept the check, and also has promised to inform the club as to the

progress and training of the guide dog, SWOC of Goldmere, a golden retriever. This dog honors the club for its previous donations, and takes his name from the abbreviation of the club's name.

Carl Curry of Gardena will accept the gavel from Steven Mallott to fulfill the position of incoming club president.

Other newly elected officers are: William Phillips, first vice president; Mrs. Twila Robinson, second vice president; Mrs. Olga Phillips, recording secretary; Mrs. Aileen Rhodwalt, corresponding secretary; John Carlson, treasurer; Arch Thistle, director; and John

Awards and trophies will also be presented to deserving members. Outstanding of these will be the Fido award to be given to the one person in dog obedience circles in Los Angeles County who has done the most for obedience in the year 1962.
