The Board of Supervisors Tuesday awarded a contract for construction of the first unit of a sea water barrier program along the County's western coastal area. Supervisor Burton W. Chace said successful bidder was Hood Corporation of Whittier, which submitted a low bid of

fresh water sources is a grow ing problem in California, Supervisor Chace declared "This West Coast Basin Barrier

"This West Coast Basin Barrier Project is urgently needed to avoid further destruction of underground water supplies." The pipeline will start in El Segundo Boulevard some 3,000 feet westerly of Aviation Bou-levard and run southerly across private property to Ma-rine Avenue in Manhattan Beach, Chace said.

The pressure-reducing sta-tion will be at the commence-ment of the line and the chlor-ination plant will be construct-ed at Anita Street near Pros-part Street

ed at Anita Street near Pros-pect Street. Project plans were prepared by M. A. Nishkian & Co. of Long Beach. Flood Control District personnel, under chief engineer M. E. Salsbury, will oversee construction and oper-ate and maintain the facility. Supervisor Chace said the program is being financed from District funds and special rone tax revenues.
