SO FAR, about 1,200 bills have been introduced in the Assembly, 700 in the Senate. These figures are about one-third the totals expected to be introduced in each house. In addition, there are a number of constitutional amendments, and a variety of resolutions.

Bills relating to almost all of the more important topics have been dropped in the hoppers of our two houses. These are the ones which will probably require more work on our part, either because they are controversial, or because of inherent difficulties in working out the best, most precise provisions.
