On Feb. 23 the commanding officer of the 28th Marine Regiment led his unit in the assault on Mount Suribachi, highest place on the island. This hill, 550 feet high, would be the scene of an event that would attract the attention of be the scene of an event that would attract the attention of the world. History was made when a patrol from the 28th Marines fought and crawled its way up the steep slopes of Suribachi.

FIVE MARINES and a Navy pharmacists's mate raised the American Flag to the breeze for the world to see, This simple act of heroism in the midst of a huge war was recorded for posterity. Joe Rosenthal, an Associated Press photographer, took the picture of the Iwo Jima flag raising that has been more widely reproduced than any other picture ever taken.

The six men who took part in the raising of the flag all in the raising of the flag all went their separate ways after the event. Three of them were later killed in action. They were Pfc. Franklin Sousley, Cpl. Harlon Block, and Sgt. Michael Strank. One, Pfc. Ira Hayes, died after the war. The two remaining survivors. Pfc. Hayes, died after the war. The two remaining survivors, Pfc. Rene Gagnon and Pharma-cists's Mate John Bradley, are still living. Bradley was later wounded on Iwo Jima after the epic flag raising.

THESE MEN who might never have attracted attention to themselves happened to be the ones chosen by fate to perform an act of heroism that day. By raising the stars and stripes on a barren island in the middle of a giant ocean, they served as examples of the gallantry found everywhere in the day to day conduct of a ferocious war against a fanatic enemy.

The three Marine Divisions The three Marine Divisions that took part in the hand to hand struggle for Iwo Jima suffered 4,189 killed, 441 missing, 15,308 wounded. This was a pretty high price to pay for eight square miles of extinct volcano.
