A progress report from the California Highway Patrol on its safety program of inspect-ing school buses, has been called for by Supervisor Ken-neth Hahn. Hahn acted after a chartered

Hahn acted after a chartered bus carrying 38 Camp Fire Girls from the Long Beach area lost its brakes and crashed near San Bernardino last week. Skillful handling of the run-away vehicle by the driver averted serious injury or death to the youngsters.

"THIS ACCIDENT again points up the need of frequent inspection of vehicles carrying children," Hahn stressed.

In 1957, Supervisor Hahn authored a county ordinance requiring inspection of all school buses, whether public or private.

school buses, whether public or private. The following year, at Hahn's suggestion, the County spon-sored a State law requiring in-spection of school buses by the California Highway Patrol. The law was passed, superceding the County ordinance.
